The Scott Act Petition.

THE names published by the Guardian prove that the petition for the repeal of the Scott Act was signed by many persons of the highest respectability.

Those who are known to be interested in the liquor traffic affirm that the liquor dealers will, with almost one consent, vote against the petition.

Besides, we have no other law to fall back upon; and, it is as certain as anything can be that another law will not be passed during the next session of the legislature.

But there is another and different reason why it may be unwise to force a contest at this time—a reason much more philosophical than any that has been adduced.

Petitioning the Minister of Railways.
