The bidding: South West North East 1 Pass 1 Pass. Opening lead—Jack of clubs. This fascinating hand came up in rubber bridge many years ago. Making the contract appeared to be routine at this point, but when South led the ace of hearts and West showed out, complications arose. There was no ready way to get to dummy and cash the high spades for diamond discards. So South came up with the brilliant idea of leading the nine of hearts, being willing to lose a trump trick unnecessarily for the

Soviet Union May Soon Set Up Observation Station On Moon

MOSCOW (AP)—A Soviet scientist said Friday Russia will launch a satellite to set up an observation station on the moon. Presumably it would be an automatic, unmanned station. Professor Aleksander Aleksandrov christened this lunar station Mirnaya, the Russian feminine form of peaceful.

Nevertheless, the prediction carried an ominous note, implying that no spot on earth is safe from Soviet rocket missiles and as a result military bases ringing the Soviet Union are losing their importance.

Aleksandrov, rector of Leningrad University and a corresponding member of the Soviet Academy of Sciences, made his prediction in the government organ Izvestia. His article also predicted that the present generation will witness flights beyond the moon to Mars. The Russians have been making many predictions since they launched their earth satellite two weeks ago.

Discussing the new horizon opened by the launching of the satellite Sputnik, Aleksandrov wrote: "All that is needed to deliver a projectile into interplanetary space, to the moon or to Mars, is to increase the power developed by the carrier rocket to a sufficient degree to overcome gravity."

The Russians said they launched Sputnik 500 miles into space. The mean distance to the moon is 238,857 miles. Mars at its nearest approach to the earth is 35,000,000 miles away. Most of Aleksandrov's article emphasized the military as well as scientific importance of Sputnik, a new tack in Soviet propaganda.

"The launching of Sputnik has finally proved that there remains no spot on earth that cannot be reached by rocket missiles and therefore the proximity of American military bases surrounding the Soviet Union is losing its exceptional importance and the Western 'position of strength' policy is losing its military and technical foundation."

U.S. scientists said a lunar station definitely is within the realm of present possibility. Dr. J. Allen Hynek, associate director of the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory, said the moon would not be much more difficult than that of launching a satellite.

CAPE CANAVERAL Fla. (AP) A test firing of a first-stage engine of the Vanguard rocket is designed to carry a U.S. earth satellite into space apparently was postponed Friday. Two tests of component Vanguard engines have been held previously.
