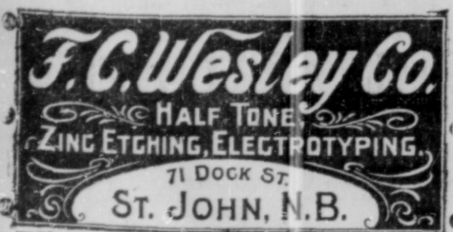

In Nova Scotia, W. A. Henry, of Halifax, once more distinguished himself and made 104 runs against the Garrison at Halifax on June 22nd. W. H. Cooper, scored during the past season 1251 runs, the largest total on record by a Canadian cricketer. Mr. Cooper played 53 innings, was not out three times, his highest score was 102; total 1251, and average 25. In the annual contest with the United States the Canadians made a good fight, and with a little better bowling would easily have pulled off a brilliant victory.
