Let's Talk It Over

The Summerside milk producers and distributors are going to make application to the Provincial Milk Board for permission to raise the price of milk by one cent per quart.

Whether anything can be done about our inflationary spiral, and the game of leap-frog between prices and wages or not, at least an attempt should be made to insure that milk be made available in the minimum quantities necessary for health and well-being to all families in Prince Edward Island.

On the other hand, there are undoubtedly families in the urban centres of Prince Edward Island that at present milk prices cannot afford to buy a sufficient amount to satisfy the nutritional needs of their children.

The Junior Red Cross and other health organizations are doing what they can to make parents see the vital necessity of providing enough milk for their children but they, of course, cannot do anything to remove the economic hurdle.

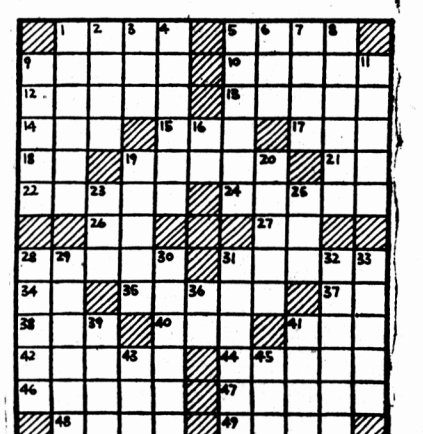
