IN MEMORIAM LINUS GALLANT

A sad gloom was cast over the vicinity of Wellington when on January 11, 1957, the death occurred of Linus Gallant in his 86th year. One of the oldest and most esteemed residents of Wellington, he lived almost all his life there, where he was a very prosperous farmer. His death came as a great shock to all who knew him for he had been in apparently good health up to within two weeks of his death. He was the son of the late Frank Gallant and Mary Ann Pembroke. His home was ever a haven for all who came there and a hearty welcome was always extended to rich or poor. Whenever his advice or help was required it was never refused. In church and community he was an ever willing worker, and a God-fearing Christian. He was visited frequently by his pastor, Rev. Leonard MacDonald, who administered to him the last rites of the Holy Catholic Church. He was the last surviving member of a family of twelve. Left to cherish his memory are his widow, the former Agnes MacDonalld, three sons Bernard, who resides in Miscouche; John Russell in Toronto; and Michael on the homestead. One daughter, Mary, Mrs. Raymond L. Gillis in Richmond; also nine grandchildren. A son Frances and a daughter Mary Loretta predeceased him several years ago. In spite of the inclemency of the weather many friends and neighbors called to visit his last remains and to pay humble tribute to one whose memory will always be cherished. The funeral was held on Monday, January 14, from his late residence to the Immaculate Church, where Rev. Leo-

CLAIMS INNOCENCE IN MURDER, Confesses To Armed Robbery VANCOUVER (CP)—Convicted police slayer Joe Gordon died on the scaffold early Tuesday after a final protestation of his innocence at a parting job at his partner in crime, James Carey, who was spared. In a note written before his execution for the murder of a Vancouver policeman in December 19 Gordon denounced Carey as a "stool pigeon." Carey was granted a last-minute reprieve by the justice department in Ottawa. "May all my friends remember me for what I am—not as others with their libelous remarks make me out to be. Someday the world at large will acknowledge my innocence — of that I am sure!" Thanks, Joe Gordon.

FEDERAL SURPLUS STILL MOUNTING OTTAWA (CP)—The federal surplus continued to rise in February, pushing the total for the first 11 months of the fiscal year to \$54,109,000, Finance Minister Harris reported Friday. However, the government's revenues and expenditures for the month eased slightly from a year ago and the February surplus of \$7,789,000 was down slightly from \$8,393,000 last year. The over-all surplus for the 11 months of the year which ends next Sunday was about triple the \$187,899,000 for the similar 1955-56 period, but Mr. Harris cautioned against concluding that the current surplus would remain high. In his budget March 14, Mr. Harris estimated the surplus for the current year would total about \$282,500,000. In the last month of the fiscal year, he said Friday, spending normally exceeds revenues by a "substantial amount." Revenues in February slipped to \$350,297,000 from \$353,721,000 last year, though the 11-month total of \$4,513,130,000 was sharply higher than the \$3,888,729,000 a year ago. Expenditures also eased in the month to \$342,508,000 from \$345,328,000, though again the 11-month total of \$3,969,021,000 was an increase over the \$3,700,830,000 last year.
