

Briefs, Questions, Answers From Commons Proceedings

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada and Russia will hold consultations next month in Moscow at which the future of their trade treaty which expires April 18, 1963 will be discussed, Trade Minister Hees said in the Commons Wednesday.

Prime Minister Diefenbaker agreed to a suggestion by Social Credit Leader Thompson that the government make a progress report soon on plans for Canada's centennial in 1967.

Antoine Belanger (SC—Charlevoix) registered a complaint about the simultaneous translation of debates from English to French.

Speaker Marcel Lambert promised to investigate and see whether improvement can be made.

Mr. Belanger also complained about delays in printing the French version of the orders of the day, a document delivered before each day's sitting to the offices of MPs. He said French-speaking MPs should receive their copies at the same time as their English-speaking colleagues.

Justice Minister Fleming said that two of the three members of the restrictive trade practices commission will not be re-appointed when their 10-year terms expire Oct. 31.

One of them, Albert S. Whitely, 61, was named by the minister.

Outside the House, it was learned that the other is the commission chairman, C. Rhodes Smith, 66.

Agriculture Minister Hamilton said a reduction in the premium paid for quality hog carcasses remains under consideration at all times.

Harcel Lessard (SC—Lac-St. Jean) asked why "illegitimate" department to trim the bonus to \$2 for grade A carcasses

from \$3. Would it be revised upward again shortly? Mr. Hamilton said all segments of the economy were asked to bear the government's cost - reducing program and since hog prices were good, this part of the farm picture had been singled out for its share.

Bernard Dumont (SC—Bellevue) asked Agriculture Minister Hamilton whether wheat buyers in Eastern Canada will

"have a chance to pay the same price as that paid by the Chinese and the Poles." Mr. Hamilton said wheat prices are all set at Fort William. "The government will be glad to take orders from anywhere in the world," he added.

Prime Minister Diefenbaker said his government has no authority to intervene in Shell Oil Company's proposed take-over of Canadian Oil Companies Limited.

He said that while Canadians may want Canadian resources to remain in Canadian hands, direct intervention by the government would be beyond its jurisdiction.

Mr. Diefenbaker was replying to H. W. Haggard, New Democratic Party house leader, who asked the government to urge the directors of Canadian Oil Companies to "put Canada first."

Russian-Canadian Trade Pact Is Expected To Be Renewed

OTTAWA (CP) — The Canadian government is anticipating renewal of the Russian-Canadian trade agreement which expires next April, trade department officials said Wednesday.

Formal negotiations concerning the agreement, originally signed in 1956 and renegotiated and extended for another three-year period in 1960, may begin around the end of the year.

Officials said a Canadian trade team is tentatively scheduled to go to Moscow in November for annual consultations with Russian officials and review of the agreement. Last year the Russians came to Ottawa.

Officials said the Canadian government has been giving thought to renewal of the agreement and expected it would be renewed. However, it was too difficult at present to predict whether any increase in trade might result.

A dispatch from Moscow Monday said the Soviet Union would likely approve renewal of the agreement.

Under the current agreement, the Soviet Union undertakes to buy \$2 worth of Canadian goods for every \$1 worth she sells to this country.

Russia agreed to buy \$25,000,000 worth of Canadian goods each year, including not less than 200,000 tons of wheat, provided the total annual value of Canadian purchases from the Soviet Union is not less than \$12,500,000. Should the total value of Canadian purchases in

any year be less than \$12,500,000 the Soviet undertaking to purchase is reduced and determined on the 2-to-1 basis.

In the 1961 calendar year Canadian exports to the Soviet Union totalled \$24,275,644. Principal commodities were wheat \$13,000,840, nickel ingots \$9,171,321, plastic and synthetic rubber \$1,327,186.

Canadian purchases from Russia were listed as \$2,745,727 by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics with chief imports being fur skins \$1,205,141, alloys for steel manufacture \$449,021 and benzol \$26,000.
