CURRENCIES

MONTREAL (CP) — The U.S. dollar Tuesday closed at a discount of 5 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, unchanged.
Pound sterling \$2.63 15-16, up 1/16. U.S. dollar bid 94 13-16; ask 94 27-32.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) — The stock market Tuesday suffered its third straight decline and sixth loss in eight sessions as all groups lost ground in moderate trading.
A few mining issues recovered some of the losses suffered Monday but other took modest lower, more from a lack of buying than for any other reason.
International Nickel led 1 1/2 points at 83 1/2 among senior basemets. Other seniors lost fractions.
Uranium were mixed to lower despite a 19-cent gain by Stantec to \$2.25. Denison lost 1/4 at 15 1/2. Advocate, Bicroft, Nipissing and Opemiska were 15-25 cents lower in other mines. McIntyre lost 1 1/2 at 92 1/2. Cochenour Williams climbed 33 cents to \$1.83.
Western oil losses ranged to 50 cents, led by Fargo at \$6.40. Canadian Devonian, Canadian Export Gas and Medallion lost 30 cents each. Canada Oil Lands gained 20 cents at \$3.50.
Index losses: Industrials 1.34 to 459.48; golds 50 to 75.80; base metals 50 to 181.00; western oils 55 to 175.01.

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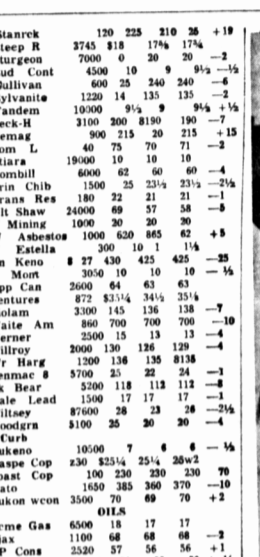

MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) — The stock market Tuesday closed moderate trading in an irregularly weaker tone with industrial price movements reaching over a point.
Among steels, Duce fell 1/2 to 25 1/2 and Steel of Canada at 66 and Atlas at 2 1/2 each slipped 1/2. In the miscellaneous group, Iron Ore fell 1/2 to 18 1/2. McColl was outstanding in refining oils, dropping 3/4 to 67 1/2, while Trans Mountain oil pipe was active in division losing a point at 96.
In base metals, International Nickel at 86 and Hudson Bay at 54 each lost a point and Aluminum was up 1/4 to 41 1/2. Among the utilities Ganteau was off 1/4 at 29 and International Utilities dropped a point to 31.
Mining and oils were down. Eastern mining was off 50 cents at 2.00 and Continental at 2.10 and Quebec Lithium at 6.95 each lost 30 cents. Profisher at 2.00 and Campbell Chib at 8.50 each lost 40 cents while Sherritt was up 10 cents at 5.15. Calgary-Edmonton off 3/4 at 23 1/2, papers new low of 9.17 at 174.55 and golds off 0.85 at 83.94.
