

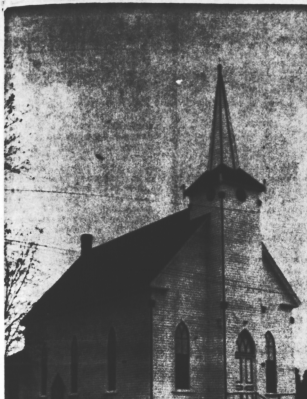
# 2 Are Killed in U.S. Train Wreck

MEDFORD, Mass. (AP)—A speeding Montreal-Boston express train—the Boston and Maine Red Wing—was wrecked Tuesday at an overpass in this city six miles north of Boston. Two American crew members were killed. More than a score of persons were injured, including four Canadians. There were no critical injuries.

The accident occurred at the site of a roadbed reconstruction project where, railway officials indicated it was going 70 miles an hour. The railway statement said the train was travelling at "excessive speed."

Paul Duggan, general chairman of the Boston and Maine local of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen, said the tape of the automatic speed recorder on the engine indicated it was going 70 miles an hour.

The other half of the engine and several of the derailed cars smashed one brick building and tipped onto a 50-foot section of a four-story brick warehouse. More than 50 workers were in the building but none was near the damaged section.



## Murray River Church Has Been Raised and Altered

On Sunday, November 17, the Murray River United Church of Christ celebrated its 64th Anniversary. The building was completed and dedicated on November 20th, 1894 during the ministry of the Rev. Ewan Gillis and served the Presbyterian Church in Canada up until the union in 1963. In that year it became the property of "The United Church of Canada."

In 1959 during the ministry of the Rev. D. Wallace MacPherson a beautiful set of electronic organs were installed and added to the church. This year a new basement was put under the church, the church house raised 9 feet. A new heating system has been installed. The church hall presents a very beautiful appearance and has regained a new look. The new basement if it is hoped, will be used as a church hall and dining room.
