**Rocket Richard Is Nervous Just Before Hockey Games**

MONTREAL (CP) — Maurice Rocket Richard, the most colorful figure in big time hockey, is a quiet family man who loves his home and dotes on his five youngsters.

The burning desire fires the 35-year-old Rocket to do unbelievable things on the ice before roaring thousands is reflected only dimly at his comfortable home in suburban Cartierville—and then on hockey dates. He eats his big meal at 3:30 p.m. and then goes to bed.

"But he doesn't sleep, probably because he is too nervous," says his dark-haired, blue-eyed wife.

**NERVOUS BEFORE GAMES**

"You never know what he is thinking. But I know he gets nervous before games, particularly in the Stanley Cup playoffs."

The Rocket's nervousness, or whatever it is, exploded for four goals Saturday in Montreal Canadiens' 5-1 win over Boston Bruins in the first game of the cup final.

"Maurice was always good," says the proud Mrs. Richard. "But I never thought he would be this good, especially at his age. I think he has a few years in hockey left."

Mrs. Richard met the man who was to become one of hockey's all-time stars when he was only 16. He was playing hockey on an open-air rink in Montreal's Lafontaine Park. They were married five years later.

In their 15 years of marriage she has missed only two National Hockey League games. Each time it was because a new Richard was arriving and she was in the hospital.

There are three boys and two girls in the family—Maurice, Jr., 12, Huguette, 13, Normand, 6, Andre, 3, and Suzanne, two months.

**YOUNGSTER IS ROCKET**

Around the Richard home Maurice, Jr., is the Rocket, not the indulgent papa.

"We started calling Maurice Jr., the Rocket when he was in the cradle," says Mrs. Richard. It was shortly before that time that the name was fastened by newspaper men on the spirited young player who was startling the hockey world.

"My oldest boy won't answer to his real name. He gets mad if we don't call him the Rocket."

The youngster sometimes takes a lot of kidding from his playmates.

**Provide Asdic For Sport Fishing**

MONTREAL (CP)—The age of electronics has developed something for the pleasure fisherman—a portable device that practically televises activity of fish in depths of 18 inches to 500 feet.

The device, which utilizes sound waves in picture fish activity on a foot-square indicator scope, will be on the market in time for the fishing season.

The fish finder weighs only 26 pounds and can be used in fresh or salt water. It notifies the fisherman of schools of fish or a single trout; identifies the unsuspecting fish and indicates the most likely spot to dangle the bait.

Part of the apparatus is a transmitter-receiver unit mounted on the hull of the boat. The unit transmits short, focused ultrasound impulses downward through the water. Fish which interrupt the sound waves are projected as blips on the scope.

The fish's exact location and depth are projected on the indicator, after lightning-fast electronic computation of the time it takes the ultrasound wave to strike the fish and bounce back.

The machine can be operated from a six, 12 or 24-volt battery.

**Durelle To Fight Title Bout With Gordon Wallace**

MONCTON (CP) — Canadian light heavyweight champion Yvon Durelle will lay his title on the line here May 30 when he meets Gordon Wallace of Brantford, Ont. or Burke Emery, Sherbrooke, Que., promoter-manager Chris Shaban said Tuesday night.

Wallace and Emery are number one and two contenders respectively. Durelle has not defended his crown since he stopped Toronto's Billy Fified two years ago.

The Baie Ste. Anne, N.B. Fisherman stopped Wallace, present British Empire light heavyweight champ, three times but the two have not met since Durelle won the title.

Emery, a newcomer to the sport is currently campaigning in the United States. He turned professional in 1954 and has 13 wins, five losses and one draw.

**Dave Charnley Wins Lightweight Title**

LONDON (AP) — Davie Charnley, 22-year-old London boiler-maker, won the British lightweight boxing championship Tuesday night by outpointing titleholder Joe Lucy in a bruising 15-rounder at Harringay Arena. Charnley weighed 133 1/2 pounds, Lucy 134 1/2.

Charnley, a hard-puncher, finished fast in the last four rounds and knocked the 27-year-old Lucy down for the count of six at one point.

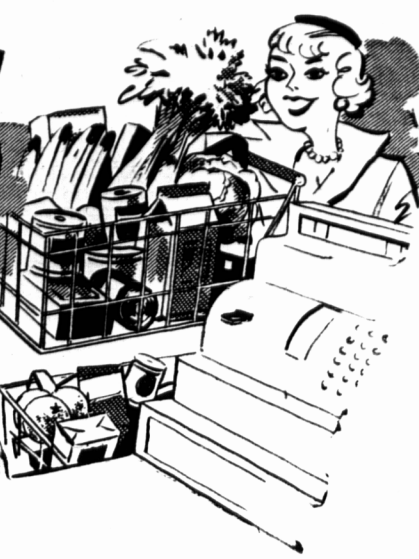
