## IN MEMORIAM

On Easter Monday, April 10th, after a brief illness stricken with pneumonia, Mrs. Bertha Robertson, widow of the late Alexander Robertson, passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Alton Robertson, Munn's Road, in her 87th year.

She had been in failing health for several years and during that period was tenderly cared for by her son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Theodore Robertson, Red Point, P. E. I.

Mrs. Robertson was born at North Lake, in 1863, daughter of the late Donald Fraser and Elizabeth McVein.

She was the second oldest of a family of five and the last survivor.

Three sisters and one brother predeceased her: Mrs. Alfred Fraser, Mrs. (Rev.) J. A. Ford, and Mrs. C. C. Dingwell, and Ezra D. Fraser.

In 1887 she married Alexander Robertson and resided at Red Point where they successfully conducted a general store.

For two periods her husband represented First King's in the local Legislature. He predeceased her in 1921.

Left to mourn are three sons and three daughters: Ralph, Kingsboro; Theodore and Alexander, Red Point; Mrs. Alton Robertson, (Bessie), Munn's Road; Mrs. Hudson Morrow (Rhoda), North Lake; Mrs. Stewart MacGregor (Martha), East Baltic.

Besides these she leaves 20 grandchildren, and one great grandchild.

Four children died in infancy. In early life she united with the Baptist Church, Kingsboro, and was a faithful and regular attendant as long as health permitted.

She was one of its oldest members, as well as a life member of the Women's Missionary Society.

Her home was one of hospitality and high ideals. She was a prodigious reader and possessed a retentive memory.

A brief service at the home followed by a funeral service in Kingsboro Baptist Church on April 12th, was conducted by Rev. H. R. Bell who spoke from Job, chapter 5, 28. Hymns used were "Sweet Bye and Bye", "Home Over There", and "Shall We Meet Beyond the River".

Despite the bad condition of the roads the congregation was large, an eloquent testimony to the place she occupied in the hearts of the people.

Pall-bearers were six grandsons, Leith, Roy, Arthur, George, Boswell and Edwin Robertson.

The hearse was in charge of Freeman Mossey.

She was laid to rest in the Kingsboro cemetery beside her husband.

## Children In Red Cross

TORONTO, May 3 - An additional 16,466 school children and high school students became members of the Junior Red Cross during the last school year, making a total of 881,060 members in Canada. Dr. Muriel Uprichard, National Director, reported at the Central Council annual meeting of Canadian Red Cross Society in Toronto today.

This is a gain of 343 branches. A total of 30,058 branches are engaged in Junior Red Cross health, service and international friendship programs across the country.

In the health field, Alberta reported 40 per cent of its branches had organized hot lunch programs. A number of high school branches helped with T.B. surveys, immunization and vaccination programs.

Local service activities are governed by community needs and provincially a good deal of work has been done with crippled and handicapped children. Juniors contributed a sum of \$167,101 last year for this project which assisted a total of 2,638 crippled children at a net cost of \$207,759.00.

Treatment of 60 pre-tuberculous children from Germany and Austria in Switzerland was one of the international relief services Juniors provided during the year from their National Service Fund. Expenditures from this fund totalled \$47,179.00 for all international relief including such purchases as Klim for Czechoslovakia, arid shoes and stockings for Finnish and Austrian children.

High school projects included an International Air Exchange, International visits, assistances at Red Cross Lodges and the welcoming of new Canadians.
