Fishermen Registering in Large Numbers In Ch'town

The number of people drawing benefits through the Charlottetown National Employment Office, has dropped by about 400 in the past two weeks. Very few of these have returned to work, but their claims have expired and they cannot draw any more money. The claims load this year was the heaviest in the sixteen year's history of the office.

The stormy and cold winter discouraged out-door work, and the blocked highways resulted in many truck-drivers and others being laid-off for long periods of time. At the present time, fishermen in a steady stream are registering at the office to comply with the amendments to the Unemployment Insurance Act which makes fishermen insurable after April 1st. Many of the fishermen have never had an insurance book before, but some have worked at various other occupations, and are familiar with Unemployment Insurance in a general way.

However, the system under which contributions will be made on behalf of fishermen is quite a bit different from the manner in which the ordinary employee contributes. Literally, hundreds of fishermen are asking the Local Office for an explanation of the Act as it now affects them. There are cases where the lobster fishermen off on the right foot, and also the buyers of lobsters. The latter, will for purposes of the Act, be deemed to be employers and responsible in most cases for stamping insurance books. There are cases where the buyer will not be recognized as the employer, and fishermen and buyers alike are being instructed as to just who is liable for contributions under various situations.

It is felt that after the amendments are in force for several months most of the hard-to-define cases will be ironed out and the fishing industry will soon adapt itself to the regulations laid down by the government. The fishermen are getting on with the amendments, and have been asking well thought-out questions about the new legislation. They have been endeavouring to cooperate to the utmost with the Unemployment Insurance officials.

GENERAL SITUATION

The general employment situation in Kings and Queens Counties, which is the area coming under the jurisdiction of the Charlottetown office, is not good at the present time. This is principally due to weather, and the picture say, local office officials could change rapidly in the next few weeks. Given good weather, there are a number of construction jobs awaiting commencement. This Spring, The Royal Bank building is one of these, the new high school on Longworth Avenue, and a large addition to the Prince Edward Island Hospital, are some of the jobs which are due to start at a fairly early date.

There are a number of smaller jobs including private residences which will be undertaken this summer, and this will help to swell the total volume of employment. There will be considerable work in construction also, as the Provincial government has already indicated, and a commencement will be made on the new Hillsborough Bridge. Though there is a seasonal lull now, the local office believes that it will be a good year indeed from an employment standpoint.

Amendment To Trade Union Act

An Act to Amend the Trade Union Act passed second reading in the Legislature yesterday.

The amendment, introduced by the Hon. Forrester Phillips, Minister of Welfare and Labour, reduces the number of employees required to form a local of a union from 15 to 16 in the province.

Speaking on the amendment, the Minister stated that Union representatives had requested that the minimum number be done away with completely, but after consultation with a government official from New Brunswick, the minimum number of six was suggested, the same as in N.B.

Mr. Phillips pointed out the original number, 15, was impractical in this province, since employers have smaller staffs than in larger cities, particularly in stores and restaurants.

Among other Bills given Second Reading were: An act to amend the Companies Act, in respect to Domiciled Companies, and an act to amend the Probate Act.

The new amendment to the Probate Act relaxed the conditions for sale, which may now be conducted with the consent of 75 per cent of the beneficiaries. Formerly, all the beneficiaries were required to agree before sale could be contracted.
