MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Hialeah Park opened the rich middle portion of Miami's thoroughbred racing season Tuesday and Maine Chance Farm's Apollo surprised the 23,621 spectators by whipping 13 other sprint stars in the \$27,025 inaugural handicap.

Counted with Hickory Hill and Munchausen in the field, Apollo carried the feathered impost of 108 pounds and sped the six furlongs in 1:10 flat over a fast track to win by a neck.

Predicts 50 Million Lbs. Butter Surplus Next May

QUEBEC (CP) — Canada will have a butter surplus of more than 50,000,000 pounds next May as the result of a drop in consumption and a rise in margarine sales, the Dairy Technicians Association of Quebec said today.

Association director J. Peter

Nadeau of Granby told the Gordon economic commission butter consumption of the average Canadian dropped six pounds since 1948 to 20.7 pounds a year and that this decline is due entirely to the production and sale of margarine.

"The practical result of this trend this year in view of our production and consumption means that in Canada on May 1, at the beginning of our next flush production season, we will have over 50,000,000 pounds of butter in excess of domestic requirements."

Mr. Nadeau, sales manager of the Granby Agricultural Co-operative, was one of the first witnesses to appear before the five-man commission as it opened hearings in this provincial capital.

Toronto, the commission was established by the federal government to predict the shape of the Canadian economy over the next 25 years. It will open hearings in Montreal Wednesday and in Toronto next week. Some 170 organizations will be heard in the six weeks of public sessions before the commission sits down to write its report.

Mr. Nadeau, in outlining the future of the dairy industry, said the proportion of Canada's dairy products produced in Quebec is increasing. The future of the dairy industry rested mostly on Canadian markets. Foreign markets were valuable but shaky.

As for development of Canadian markets, that depended mostly on federal government policies, he said. The government had a definite responsibility to protect the dairy industry against imports of low-priced substitutes.

Potato Prices Move Upward

TORONTO (CP)—Heavy floods, disrupted processing and shipping problems have caused 15-to-25-cent rises in wholesale prices of Maritime potatoes here and may still go higher, Toronto produce wholesalers said Monday.

Prince Edward Island potatoes were \$1.75-1.85 a carlot bag against \$1.65 last week while New Brunswick potatoes were up 15 cents to \$1.60.

Prices to the trade were \$2.25 up from \$2-2-15 with New Brunswick \$1.75-2 from \$1.60-1.75 last week.

One dealer said there were only five or six cars of potatoes at the market compared with the usual 20-25. He saw little chance of an improved situation before the end of the month.

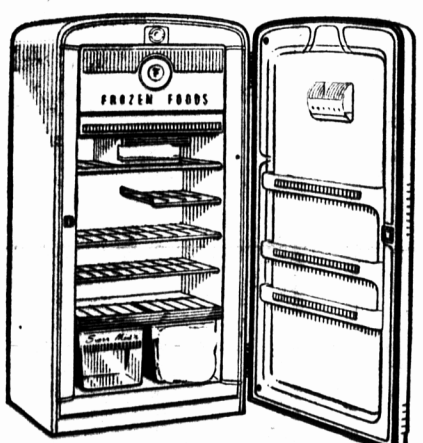
