CLEVELAND, Dec. 25 — (AP)— With the steel industry completing a record shattering production year, the magazine Steel predicts today that 1951 will be even bigger.

"Thirteen new blast furnaces are scheduled to be added," the magazine says, "in addition to more than 10,000,000 tons of ingot capacity. Not all will be completed next year.

"Among new projects not yet announced officially is a new east coast steel plant to be located in New Jersey on the Delaware River below Philadelphia." (The magazine did not say what firm would build this plant).

The U. S. ingot rate last week held unchanged at 101.5 per cent of capacity.

churia. Today, however, no United Nations forces remained north of the 38th parallel, the old north-south frontier that split Korea in half.

The vast armies of Communist China had intervened, forcing the U.S. Eighth Army in the west into a hasty 120-mile retreat, and missing destruction of the 10th Corps only because of the historic beach-head withdrawal.

Today the Red invaders had edged within 21 miles of Seoul, the southern capital, in the preliminaries of an all-out offensive. They had threatened to launch it on Christmas Day, but it failed to come.

Best Christmas Present

The 10th Corps withdrawal, applauded by President Truman as "the best Christmas present I could have," was made in 14 fighting, freezing days and nights.

For two solid weeks the thrusting Reds were held at bay by naval guns, planes, artillery and determined doughboys while 109 naval ships completed the unprecedented, orderly retreat. They took their weapons and vast stores of supplies with them to fight again in South Korea.

MaJ-Gen. Edward M. Almond, 10th Corps commander, in announcing the end of the operation, disclosed that "all elements are either at sea or landed in the Pusan-Pohang concentration area" near the southeast tip of Korea.

Pusan was the old beachhead perimeter which the U.S. Eighth Army held against heavy odds last summer until their breakout to the north following the Sept. 15 10th Corps landing at Inchon.

Word of the successful withdrawal drew a "well-done" for Gen. Douglas MacArthur and Almond from President Truman at his home in Independence, Mo.

U.N. commanders were jubilant at extricating five combat divisions — the U.S. 1st Marine Division, the U.S. 3rd and 7th, and the Republic of Korea 3rd and Capital Divisions — from the icy wastes of Northeast Korea against overwhelming Communist forces.

Red Drive Impending

Optimism was tempered Christmas Day by the menace of an impending gigantic Chinese Communist offensive in the west.

U.N. troops braced in their icy foxholes Christmas for the blow. Communist leaflets, air-dropped presumably at night over South Korean positions, had said the Chinese would attack "on Christmas" and urged South Koreans to surrender because they would be

CANADIAN JET PILOT IS "ON LOAN" TO U. S.

FLY-MA. Omer J. Levesque, Montreal jet pilot, has been loaned by the R.C.A.F. to the U.S. Air Force jet fighter group in Korea to fly F-86 Sabre jets, fastest fighters in the world. A Second World War ace, Levesque shot down the first German Focke-Wulf in last war and knocked out three other Nazi planes before he was shot down. He was fished out of the English Channel by Germans and held prisoner for three years.

For four days, AP correspondent William J. Waugh reported, U.N. forces have been in contact with Chinese troops around the 38th parallel.

All day and until 8 P.M. (6 A.M. E.S.T. Monday) when Waugh's dispatch was written, he said, "the frozen battleline was ominously quiet, except for patrol action." Patrols killed 41 Chinese and captured nine.

MacArthur's headquarters announced that hostile units of undisclosed size reconnoitered the Sinsan area, only 21 miles north of Seoul. Other Red units were poised from 28 to 32 miles northwest and northeast of Seoul.

South Korean army headquarters said Chinese Reds "appeared in many places" along the parallel, from the extreme west coast to within 40 miles of the east coast, a distance of 120 miles along the pre-war frontier.

At this critical juncture, Lt.-Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, the new commander of the U.S. Eighth Army arrived in Tokyo Monday night by air from Washington. He replaces Lt.-Gen. Walton H. Walker who was killed Saturday in a jeep accident.

Walker's body lay in state at his home in Yokohama.

At Seoul — closely menaced for the second time in six months by Red forces — the South Korean National Assembly decided to adjourn. It plans to reconvene next month, "probably in Pusan," a reliable source said.

President Syngman Rhee sadly called upon his government to evacuate the capital as the Chinese forces drew closer.

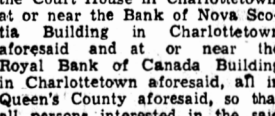

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Dominion Assumes Influential Role in World Affairs

 OTTAWA, Dec. 25 — (CP) — The expanding world struggle against Communist imperialism, with battle-ravaged Korea in the forefront, intensified Canada's responsibilities in the international sphere in 1950.

It brought graver problems to the Government's council tables, sent Canadian troops abroad for the first time since the end of the second world war and placed fresh demands on this country's delegation to the United Nations and on its globe-girdling diplomatic services.

Canada already was deep in international efforts to save the peace when the Korean war broke late in June, bringing a quick step-up in activity on both the home and the diplomatic fronts. Canada played a leading role in moves both to push ahead North Atlantic defence preparations and keep the Korean fight from assuming world-wide proportions.

In one field, Canada gave leadership to the rest of the United Nations in the Korean crisis. In forming a special force for Korea, she earmarked it to carry out Canada's U.N. obligations generally and thus became the first country to provide forces for U.N. policing duties wherever they are needed.

Co-operation with U. S.
 As part of the strengthening of defences, Canada and the United States exchanged diplomatic notes which virtually marked a revival of the wartime Hyde Park agreement, under which the Canadian and American war production machines operated almost as one. Closer production links were established.

With Canadian troops taking the field in a new, though smaller, conflict, this country announced its intention to draw the second world war to a close. The government said it would follow Britain, France and the U. S. in ending its state of war with Germany "as soon as it is in a position to do so."

At the same time, Canada joined other Commonwealth nations in seeking to avert the spread of communism in vital south-east Asia. She took part in the formulation of the Colombo plan, which proposes to extend technical and other aid to these underdeveloped regions over a period of years.

As the year drew to a close, Britain's Prime Minister Attlee came to Ottawa for talks with Prime Minister St. Laurent and his cabinet. The visit followed one with President Truman in Washington. No hint escaped of what went on behind the council doors here, but both sides termed the talks "helpful."

As activity within the North Atlantic pact stepped up, defence minister Claxton and Mr. Pearson flew to Brussels in December for meetings of the organization's defence and foreign ministers.

Mr. St. Laurent himself prepared to go to London in the New Year for a meeting in London of Commonwealth Prime Ministers. At this conference, the commonwealth chiefs were expected to review the world situation as a whole as it affects the commonwealth and its member states.

Spectacular Blaze Aboard Tanker

NEW ORLEANS, La., Dec. 25 — (AP)— A spectacular blaze aboard the tanker Esso Baltimore, which for a time threatened the port of New Orleans, was brought under control today after a five-hour battle.

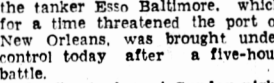
The fire broke out Sunday night after the 10,000-ton tanker and a tow of oil barges collided in the Mississippi River. An explosion set both afloat.

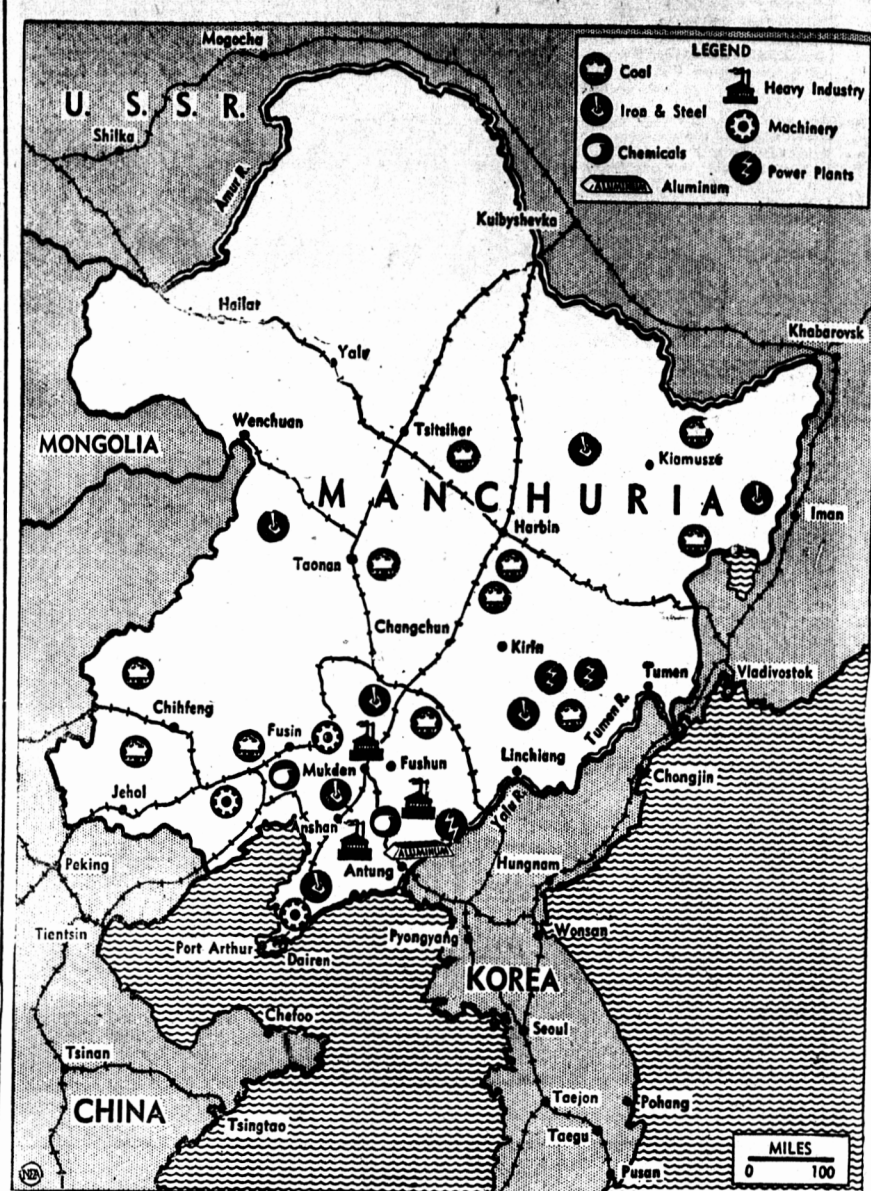
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Bomb Targets for MacArthur -- 'if' --
