THE LEGISLATURE

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL DEBATE.

MR. SCRIMGOUR.—I am very much surprised at the course pursued by the hon. Leader of the Opposition. He got up and denounced every man on this side of the House for disfranchising the Dominion officials, and then before the sound of his voice had died away he gets up again and moves a clause to disfranchise the officials of Local Government...

MR. CAMPBELL.—I did not expend any money on it.

MR. SCRIMGOUR.—Your predecessor did. There was also an amount in the Public Accounts for repairs to Cardigan Bridge, but there was no such work done at all. Then he had men doing work at Montague Bridge in the depth of winter which could have been done for one-third of the cost if done at a proper time of the year...

THE QUESTION WAS PUT ON THE AMENDMENT proposed by Mr. Campbell.

Contents—Messrs. Campbell, Poole, Ross, Nicholson—4.

Non-Contents—Messrs. Dodd, Kiekham, Laird, Mackenzie, Macnutt, Rogers, Scrimgeour—7.

MR. SCRIMGOUR moved that Section 18 be amended by providing that no elector who receives money from the Dominion Government as fishery bounty be permitted to vote.

HON. MR. ROGERS.—No fisherman is employed by the Dominion Government and this would only be encumbering the clause with unnecessary words.

THE MOTION WAS AGREED TO.

MR. SCRIMGOUR moved the following:— Section Forty-seven to be struck out and the following substituted:— (47) The Third Electoral District shall be divided into Three Electoral Divisions.

(1) The First Electoral Division shall comprise and include Townships Numbers 66 and 51.

(2) The Third Electoral Division shall comprise and include Townships Numbers 52 and 53.

(3) The Fourth Electoral Division shall comprise and include that portion of Lot 54 lying to the north of Grand River Road and also all that portion of Lot 55 lying to the north of the Grand River Road and also all that portion of Lot 55 lying to the south of the Grand River Road and east and north of the Grand River.

The motion was agreed to.
