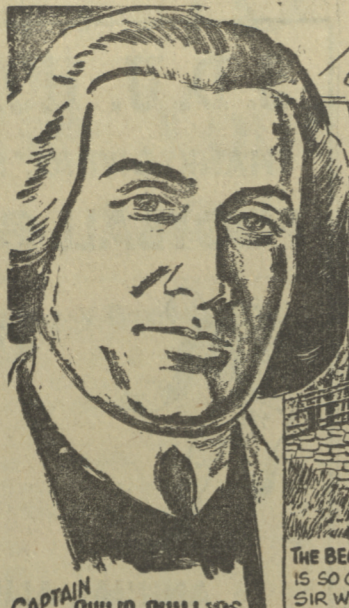

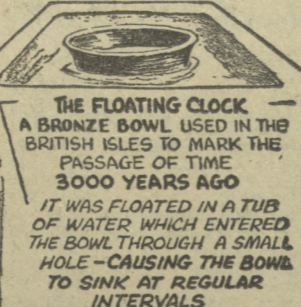

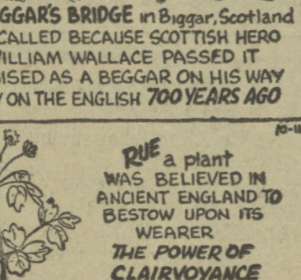

CONTRACT BRIDGE

The bidding:
South West North East

Opening lead—queen of clubs.
A delicate approach is required to arrive at the best final contract in this hand. At stake a grand slam. It hinges on whether the ultimate contract is seven hearts or seven spades. If the right choice is made, North-South score, 2,410 points. The wrong choice brings a deficit of 100 points. The enormous swing involved rests on selecting which suit to play as trump in such a case. And probably, in most hands, such a view would be correct. But in the present hand, all the chips ride on the decision made. South's jump to four spades involves a principle of bidding not

generally well understood. Some players are under the misapprehension that this is a closeout bid. On the contrary, the jump to game by the opening bidder is a strong bid, suggesting slam possibilities. The closeout bid takes place when the responder immediately raises the opening bidder's suit to game. North's subsequent bidding was based on the application of this principle. The critical point in the bidding is reached when North, through the use of the Blackwood convention, learns South has three aces and a king. Once North determines to bid a grand slam, the selection of the trump suit becomes a cardinal issue. He knows South has four spades. He also knows South has more hearts than spades, probably five, since he opened the bidding with a heart.

North sees that if he bids seven spades, he will be able to discard one of his losers on South's fifth heart. But this, he notes, leaves him with a diamond loser. North also observes that if the contract is seven hearts, the fifth spade in dummy will take care of one of South's losers. This will become a vital factor if South's distribution is 4-5-2-2. North therefore concludes that the discard which can be obtained in either contract is far more valuable if the final contract is seven hearts.

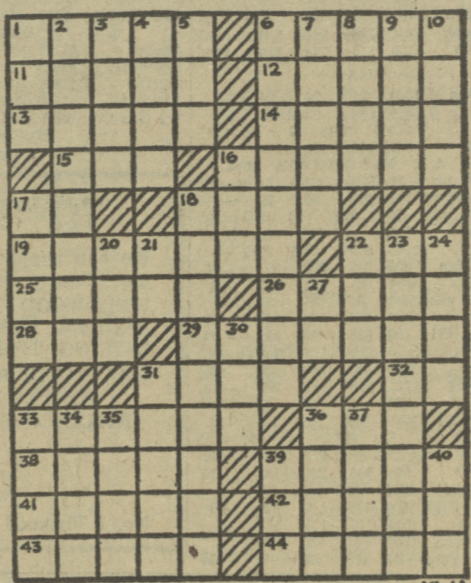
WRITER ASKS ASYLUM
BERLIN (AP)—Marek Hlasko, one of Poland's leading writers, has asked for political asylum in West Berlin. He is outspokenly against totalitarianism, Polish nationalism, the Roman Catholic Church in Poland and the old social system.
