The latest news, first of all.

The real estate of the late James A. Wallace consisting of 165 acres of land, dwelling house, barns, etc., were sold yesterday at Alberton and were bid by Albert Reid of Coleman for \$5,125.

The Summerside Council has issued flyers warning the public to keep off the water works and sewerage trenches, as the spring rains have made them exceedingly dangerous in some places. On Saturday a horse became mired in the spring on North Marslet St., and was got out with considerable difficulty.

D. A. Pickering, Summerside, is putting the finishing touches on a boat which will be, when completed, one of the finest ever built here. This boat, which is being built for P. C. Gallant, for use as a pleasure and also in connection with his lobster factory during the fishing season, it measures 22 feet keel, 30 feet over all and 7 feet beam, and will be driven by a 7 H.P. Motor. Mr. Pickering has also built during the past winter two other boats both of beautiful model and excellent finish, one of which is by F. D. McDonald, for use on one of his tug boats and the other he has not yet disposed of.
