COMPANY EJECTING STRIKING EMPLOYEES

LULOW, Mass., Nov 28—In fulfillment of their announced intention of compelling strikers and their families to leave the dwellings owned by the company, officials of the Ludlow Manufacturers Association began having writs of ejectment served. Fifteen company houses were emptied of their contents early this forenoon and the occupants ordered to seek shelter elsewhere. The strikers who left the company's jute and hemp products mills late in September as a protest against a new system of work which they claim meant lower wages for them announced today that they intended to appeal to the Town officials to provide habitations for the families turned out of the company's buildings. The town authorities have not yet indicated how they will meet this appeal.

Of the 2800 employees who went on strike, about six hundred have returned. Some portions of the plant are being operated, but the greater part of it is shut down. The company will have a number of families ejected from its houses each day until all are relieved. Practically all the employees live in company houses.

THREE DEAD FROM COAL STOVE FUMES. AURORA, Ont., November 28.—A gruesome discovery was made here yesterday, when the dead bodies of Mrs. John Flintoff, her granddaughter Miss Laura MacDonald, aged about fourteen years and Fred Blake, a young Englishman, aged 19, were all found asphyxiated from gas in the home of Mrs. Flintoff.

Mrs. Flintoff was a widow, her husband having died about six years ago, and the little granddaughter had lived with her for some time. Fred Blake, until a week ago, was employed on the farm of Thomas Roberts, a short distance out of the village, since which time he had boarded at the home of Mrs. Flintoff. His mother and a number of brothers and sisters reside in England. Blake had been in Canada only a year or two, and was employed in the Fleuris Agricultural Works.

No stir had been noticed around the Flintoff house since Tuesday night. A neighbor secured the assistance of others and an entrance was effected through a window, when the bodies of the three victims were found lying in their rooms, apparently asleep. The Flintoff home is a one storey cottage and the stove an old-fashioned self-feeder. The air was badly fouled by the presence of coal gas when the neighbors first entered.

INSANE MAN SHOOT'S GENERAL. PARIS, France, Nov. 29.—An individual, believed to be insane and having an imaginary grievance against the War Department, shot and dangerously wounded General Verard at the Hotel Continental, as the general was entering the hotel to attend a banquet.
