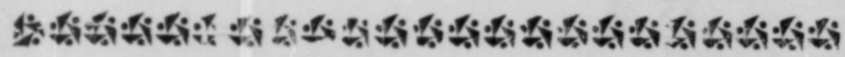

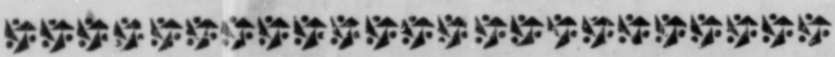

### IMPORTANT EVIDENCE FOR DREYFUS

#### Casimer-Perier Makes a Dramatic Statement.

DECLARES THE INNOCENCE OF THE PRISONER,

And Gives One of the Reasons Why he Refused the Presidency.

(SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.)

NEW YORK, Aug. 16.—The correspondent of the Sun at Rennes cabled this version of part of M. Casimer Premier's testimony before the Dreyfus court Martial.

M. Casimer Perier said that neither he nor the Cabinet saw the dossier till a fortnight after the condemnation of M. Dreyfus. "For the honor of the magistracy and the honor of France" the ex-president added, "I feel compelled to speak the truth in defence of an innocent man."

This declaration of M. Casimer Perier was uttered in a vibrant voice rising till it broke with emotion.

There was an outburst of applause in the Court room. The President threatened to clear the Court if the demonstration was repeated.

M. Casimer Perier proceeded with his testimony occasionally referring to a paper which he held to refresh his memory as to a date, but speaking without hesitation. He said that one motive for his resignation of the presidency was the ignorance in which he had been kept regarding the Dreyfus affair. He reiterated that he had sworn to the truth.

The Philippine Campaign.

MANILA, 15.—Advices from Calcutta, under date of August 11, report that Gen. MacArthur, took the Ninth Regiment, a battalion of the 82nd, and a detachment of the First Artillery from Calcutta to Santa Rita, near Bacolor, on Friday morning. The entrance of the troops into the town was not opposed, the insurgents fleeing as the Americans approached. The troops had a hard march of ten miles, in some places being obliged to wade waist-deep in water. Many were exhausted.

Lieut. Hazard, of General Wheaton's staff, with five scouts, marched up the railroad into Angeles. A small force of rebels attacked the scouts outside the town and Lieut. Hazard sent for reinforcements. Gen. Wheaton's orders, however, were that the Americans should not occupy Angeles; and a force of six hundred or seven hundred rebels appearing, Lieut. Hazard retired.

### THE PLAGUE

Great Excitement in Spain, Portugal and Italy.

MADRID, Aug. 16.—The Gazette announces a quarantine on everything arriving from Portugal. Sanitary posts have been established on the frontier for the inspection of travellers.

OPORTO, Aug. 16.—Since the outbreak of the plague here there have been 66 cases and 11 deaths from the disease.

ALEXANDRIA, Aug. 16.—All of Egypt is in excitement over the disease. There have been 1862 cases reported since July 18th.

Arrest of Ministers of the Reform Party

### A Russian Free Port.

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 16.—The Czar has issued an order stating that Tallien-Wan will henceforth be a free port.

### Italians in China.

PEKIN, Aug. 15.—Marquis Raggi, the Italian Charge d'Affaires, has asked the Tsung-li-Yamen for permission to open mines in Che-Kiang, and to establish an Italian professorship in Peking University. He has also asked for two railway concessions, which it is not likely, will be granted. His other requests will probably be conceded.

### Church Decision.

LONDON, Aug. 15.—Chancellor Tristram of the Diocese of London, has decreed that the crucifix displayed in St. Ethelburga's church is illegal, and has ordered that the table of the ten commandments be returned.

### NOTES AND COMMENTS.

—An observer at the capital has remarked that the Opposition came to the session expecting that the general election many thought might come off would give the Government a new lease of power; it has quitted the capital confident that the appeal to the people, when it comes, will send the Liberal party back to the position it occupied for eighteen years before 1896.

### DIRECT STEAMSHIP

Better Late than Never—The Arrangement as Good as Closed.

OTTAWA, Aug. 16.—Mr. Farquharson, Premier of P. E. Island, is here arranging with the minister of Marine for the establishment of a direct steamship service between Charlottetown and Liverpool. The contract is as good as closed—It provides for a fortnightly sailing from the Island by a steamship of about 4000 tons to be equipped with cold storage for the transportation of butter, cheese and other perishable freight. The service to commence about 6th of September. The subsidy voted by Parliament last session for this service was \$7000.

### TRAINS COLIDE

Engineer Killed and Others Injured

OTTAWA, August 16.—A passenger by the Winnipeg train, just arrived, reports that the C. P. R. "Imperial Limited" which left here on Monday at an early hour yesterday, came to grief just beyond Sudbury. It collided with an east bound train. The engineer of the "Imperial Limited" is reported killed, and several persons injured.
