Mrs. Stewart had been ill for the past several weeks. Born at Alberton, a daughter of the late Hon. Benjamin Rogers a former Minister of Agriculture and Lieut. Governor of Prince Edward Island, and Mrs. Rogers, she received her early education in the elementary school at Alberton and later attended Prince of Wales College. Subsequently she attended Mt. Allison Ladies' college Sackville, N. B. and Royal Victoria Ladies' College at Montreal.

## Board Of Trade Workshop To Be Held On Saturday

Something new is being planned by the Charlotteville Board of Trade for Saturday afternoon Nov. 24 when representatives from all the Boards of Trade in the Province will hold a "Work-shop" at the Charlotteville Hotel. Taking part in the meeting will be members from Summerside, Montserrat, Souris, Crapaud-Victoria and Alberton-West Prince.

The purpose of the get-together is to provide a forum for Board of Trade discussions on common problems incident to local conditions. Such important matters as transportation, agriculture, fisheries and tourist promotion will naturally be on the agenda and in addition any matters of purely local interest may be brought before the meeting with a view to an exchange of ideas.

Hon. Dougald MacKinnon, Minister of Highways and other officials have been invited to attend. At five o'clock an informal reception, sponsored by the Charlotteville Board of Trade will be held at the Charlotteville Hotel to be followed by a dinner meeting of the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council members in the Maritime Board of Trade and an active figure in the organizing of APEC.

At this meeting the Island directors of APEC for 1956-57 will be elected.
