New Letter From Mad Bomber

NEW YORK (AP)—The New York Journal-American says it had received a new letter "positively identified as having been sent by the man commonly referred to as New York's 'mad bomber.'"

The Journal-American reproduces parts of the letter signed "F P" and hand printed in block letters.

In the letter the man says he is extending the "truce" on the planting of bombs announced in the Journal-American Dec. 26. A number of persons have been injured by explosions of the homemade bombs planted in various public places around town since 1940.

The letter says the man had been "totally permanently disabled" by an injury on a job at a Consolidated Edison Co. plant some 20 years ago. It also said he "did not get a single penny of compensation for a lifetime of misery and suffering."

The letter says the man had Plains, N.Y., at 7:30 Saturday night, was in response to an open letter to the bomber published in the Journal-American last Thursday in which the newspaper appealed to the man to continue his "truce" and give more details of his grievances.

SMOKEY FOR CANADA
WASHINGTON (AP)—Smockey the brown bear that symbolizes forest fire prevention in the United States, is being prepared for a similar role in Canada. The agriculture department said Thursday an agreement has been signed with the Canadian Forestry Association, providing for a co-operative fire prevention effort with Smockey as the symbol for the two-country program.

Britain Believed Planning Further Defence Reductions

LONDON (Reuters)—Speculation says the estimated £20,000,000 saved by the cutback announced Tuesday is "only a fraction of the cuts due this year."
The government, the Chronicle says, wants an ultimate saving of between £100,000,000 and £200,000,000, adding that "a realistic beginning" will be announced in the forthcoming service estimates.

The Daily Herald reports as a fact that "selection by ballot on the American pattern" is one of four new methods of call-up which the new cabinet is considering.

The Conservative Daily Mail banner lines a report that "conscription in its present form is to be abolished," and the new form of selection "is expected to be on the U.S. pattern."

The Herald, which supports the Labor party, comments that a system of calling men up by numbers or ballots, selecting them according to the need for their qualifications and allowing them to appeal against the draft "could touch off a first-class political row in Britain because it could so obviously lead to abuses and anomalies."

MORE THAN NECESSARY
The newspaper's military correspondent says that the "service chiefs now have admitted to the cabinet that the two-year call-up is putting more men into uniform than the army can make use of."
He adds that a parliamentary motion to call up boys report, to be published soon, "will surplus to service requirements."

Under the present system, some 230,000 youths enter the armed forces every year. Miners, policemen, firemen and merchant mariners are exempt. Farmers, students and other young specialists can be exempted, but have to apply for deferments.
The Daily Mail report says "the call-up revision forms part of cuts in defence spending."

The government announced Tuesday a major trimming of auxiliary defence forces. The RAF will disband most of its reserve units, including 20 fighter squadrons manned by weekend recruits.

RECALL FORCES
The navy said it is disbanding its reserve branch of the fleet air arm. A government order for 100 Hawker Hunter jet fighters has been cancelled. The Liberal News Chronicle
