Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP)—Prices fluctuated to a point and over in moderate trading Wednesday on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchange.

International Nickel featured the base metals by soaring to a gain of 4 1/2 points. Noranda was ahead a point and Hudson Bay was off a point in the steels.

Papers were in good demand as Bathurst B climbed five points. Howard Smith improved two and International gained one. Powell River lost a point in the section.

Banking moved solidly forward led by Montreal with a gain of 2 1/2. Beverages eased as Seagraves dipped 1/2. In miscellaneous trade Dominion Glass advanced two points and Chrysler improved 1/4.

Mines and western oils were mixed in a 10 cent range with Cleveland Copper, Eastern Asbestos, Fundy, Quebec, Chib and Mentary up. Bateman Bay, El Peney and Quebec Oil were down. In the seniors Triad, Royalite and Steep Rock gained in a point range as Falconbridge advanced 2 1/4.

The stock exchange show banks up 0.77 at a new high of 58.72, utilities off 0.5 at 145.2, industrials up 1.9 at 329.2, combined up 1.1 at a new high of 167.9, papers up 4.44 at a new high of 1703.45 and

golds unchanged at 84.33.
