Co-operatives Subject of Talk At Murray Hbr.

Mr. Reid Sangster, New Harbor, N. S., was the guest speaker at a co-operative meeting held at Murray Harbour last night presided over by Mr. Charles Richards, Mr. Sangster, a fieldman of the co-operative movement in Nova Scotia, spoke eloquently on the benefits which co-operation has brought to the fishing and farming areas in that province. He described conditions in these areas, particularly that of the south shore prior to the beginning of co-operation, and continued through its development to describe the changed conditions as they exist today. He urged the large gathering to use their own efforts to build a better economic and social community through working together, and in that manner show that the spirit of co-operation is for all.

He pointed out that since farmers and fishermen produced basic commodities, it was their right to reap the profits from their labours. They alone should own and control their own products, and set up services which would bring them the greatest return. Credit systems, banks, canning factories, stores, and many other services have been provided through co-operative effort in many places, he said, and he was not adverse to thinking that the same could be done in a natural area such as Murray Harbour where a co-operative filleting plant, and a co-operative store could be easily undertaken, together with an expanded fishing program. He emphasized that the people of the community could do this on their own effort, and thereby be of assistance not only to themselves but also to the community as a whole.

Rec. William Simpson, of the extension department, St. Dunstan's University, also spoke briefly commending Mr. Sangster on his excellent address, and urging the plan of co-operation.

During the meeting a film on Danish co-operation was shown illustrating the benefits which co-operatives had brought to that country.

mals must be judged on the fitness for breeding purposes.

(b). No animal shall be awarded a prize unless removed from its stall or pen and exhibited before the judge is in the show ring.

(c). Judges cannot award prizes to unworthy exhibits. It is the intention that no premium or distinction of any kind should be given to any animal or article that is not deserving. These rules must be strictly followed whether or not there is competition.

(d). The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases, except where fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases, the executive committee or such referee may appoint or mark the decision.
