F. S. Murphy Dies Suddenly

MONTAGUE — The death of Francis Stephen Murphy, Montague, occurred suddenly at his home on Saturday, Dec. 30. He was in his 58th year. The late Mr. Murphy was a well known citizen of Montague where he was born the son of the late Frank V. Murphy, and Mary Robertson Murphy.

Left to mourn are his wife, the former Florence Fraser of Montague; two sons: Gerald of Montreal and Albert with the RCAF in Germany; four daughters: Ruth, Mrs. William Gurney of Truro, N.S.; Frances, Mrs. Kimball Jarvis, Gagetown, N.B.; Mildred, RN, Halifax, N.S.; Pauline, Mrs. Arnold Gallant, Charlottetown; one sister, Mrs. Harold Hynes, Montague; one brother, Dr. Clarence Murphy, Charlottetown. One brother Vincent passed away in 1959. There are also several grandchildren. The funeral will take place at St. Mary's Church, Montague on Tuesday Jan. 2 at 10 a.m. Interment will be in the church cemetery.

90 Percent Pay Parkdale Licence

More than \$5,000 has been collected in non-resident work licences in Parkdale this year, a significant item in the village, which budgeted for revenue of \$54,000 for the current year. About 90 per cent of the affected workers have paid up, it was learned Saturday from

Mr. S. Webster, chairman of the village commissioners who are facing court action in the problem of collecting the balance of the tax. Almost all affected workers have paid the tax, with the exception of the experimental farm employees and the provincial exhibition employees. The farm workers have reportedly refused to pay the tax, on an understanding that the federal department of justice will question the power of the village to collect it; and approximately 39 people working in the park-mutual section of the Charlottetown Driving Park are

swinging the result of a test before the court, where information has reportedly been laid and action is expected soon. The park-mutual workers have agreed to split court costs on the test case, and they are awaiting the court decision before paying or refusing to pay the tax, themselves. There are approximately 30 affected workers in the provincial exhibition set up, it was learned. The controversial work licence legislation will be wiped off the statute books at the session of the legislature early next year, it has been stated authoritatively.

but that does not affect the powers of villages or municipalities to collect the tax in 1961. Need for the special tax revenue in Parkdale was made more urgent when it became necessary to hire a policeman in mid-year, purchase the necessary uniforms, and buy and properly equip a police vehicle. Mr. Webster said Saturday. The action became necessary when it was decided that the RCMP would stop policing villages with a population of more than 500, it was explained.
