We don't consider it eavesdropping to "hear" our children's prayers. Nor is it too much trouble! In fact, it is part of our responsibility to God.

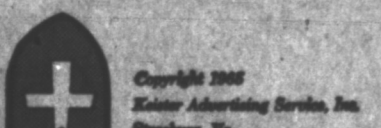

Change in Liturgy Takes Place Sunday

The new vernacular will be introduced on an extensive scale in the liturgy of Roman Catholic Churches in all dioceses this coming Sunday, March 7.

In keeping with decisions of the Vatican Council, the bishops of Canada have set up norms governing the full extent to which the vernacular may now be used as of March 7.
