Turkeys sold at from 75c to \$1.25 each.

DIDST KNOW IT WAS LOADED.—On Tuesday night last, Allan Fletcher, son of Professor Fletcher, of Queen's College, Kingston, aged ten years, who is staying at Demill's boarding house over on the Bay shore, Carleton, N. B., shot Miss McGill, a maid in the same house, with a revolver that he did not know was loaded. The bullet lodged in the young woman's back and was extracted on Wednesday. The boy demanded her money or life and narrowly escaped taking the latter.

GENERAL TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

LONDON, July 24.—A despatch to the Times from Tien Tsin states that Japan's plan in negotiating the commercial treaty with China and in vacating Liao Tung territory, has been deliberately planned pending the completion of the British elections, Japan helping to induce Lord Salisbury's government to support her against Russia.

EDINBURGH, July 24.—The Scotch peers met in this city this afternoon and elected sixteen of their number to represent them in the house of lords in the new parliament. Every one of the sixteen peers elected is a unionist.

TORONTO, July 24.—At the request on the body of Alice Peitzel to-night a verdict of wilful murder was returned against Holmes, who is at present in Philadelphia, for murder and alleged defrauding of insurance companies.

LONDON, July 24.—The aggregate amount of the money prizes won by the Canadian marksmen during the Bisley shooting was \$350.

LONDON, July 24.—As a result of the short water supply caused by the turning off of the flow by the water companies, except for about two hours in the twenty-four, the sanitary condition of the Whitechapel and Poplar districts has become extremely bad. Already there have been three deaths from fever contracted from this cause, and the situation threatens to become still more serious.

NORTH SCITUATE, Mass., July 24.—An attempt was made last night to blow up the Knollsaid hall while a religious meeting was in progress. Evangelistic meetings have been held in the hall for some time and a considerable disturbance has been created by the rough element who attended the services. A number of the offenders have been arrested and fined. Last night, when the explosion occurred, there was a panic among the congregation, and a number of women fainted, but nobody was hurt.
