conscience. Shakespeare truly said, "Good name in man or woman is the immediate jewel of their souls." One who would either begin, or carry on, a slander to impugn the good name of another is guilty of a crime worse than theft of goods. Material things can be restored; a damaged reputation cannot be repaired.

DEAR MISS DIX: I am a woman of 41 with a grown son and daughter both married. Recently I was married again to a wonderful man. Our trouble is with his son. The boy was 2 1/2 when we were married, and has been brought up by my husband's people. They had never taught him anything, and he was hopelessly spoiled. Now I am having a very difficult time teaching him manners and trying to make him mind me. He talks back and resists any punishment I give him. I never had trouble of this kind with my own children. I don't know whether to leave the house or turn the child back to his grandparents. He likes me, but just won't obey.

ANSWER: No matter how discouraged you get, and I know a stubborn boy that age can be a trial, try to keep him with you. You will be a much better influence on him than his grandparents and when the child is straightened out you will be richly rewarded in the knowledge of a good job done.

I suggest first a thorough physical examination of the boy. Make sure his hearing and sight are good; impairment of either sense often leads to behavior problems. Then consult a family counselor or child guidance director. Either may be located through your telephone book. Remember, this youngster has never had a permanent home, has never known the security of parental love and is bound to be difficult until he has the assurance of being surrounded by love and harmony.

DEAR MISS DIX: I'm a senior in an all-girl high school. We are having our prom this fall. I'm going steady with a boy and plan to ask him to the prom. I understand that I'm expected to buy the tickets, but am I also expected to pay for the transportation?
PUZZLED

ANSWER: Many high schools have adopted the excellent practice of issuing prom leaflets in preparation for this so-important event. The leaflet lists all the obligations of the girl and boy, expenses, proper attire, etc. A faculty advisor at your school should be at hand to solve such problems for you. Knowing exactly how to conduct all details of the prom will make the evening much more pleasant for you, as well as all the other girls.

As you understand, tickets are paid for by the girl, but all other expenses are the boy's. At least, that is the usual custom. Any deviation at your school will, I am sure, be explained by your advisor.
