Toronto Stocks

By The Canadian Press TORONTO, (CP)—Prices tended higher in active trading Thursday's stock market. Western oils ended their recent losing streak and advanced with Great Plains in the lead, up \$1 Britat and Canada Southern were up 20 cents and Bailey-Selburn added 15 cents in active trading.

Gold was stronger with most categories slightly higher but few outstanding issues. Base metal activity was concentrated in the seniors in foreign trading, but shifted to junior later. International Nickel was up 37 1/2 cents to lead.

Uranium was slightly weaker and Bathurst - area base metals gained a little in mixed trading. Gunmar showed the biggest change with a 50-cent drop. Closing indexes showed golds up 37 at 70.99, base metals down 0.2 at 139.59 and western oils down 14 at 93.03.

Tourist Boom Experienced By Newfoundland

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., (CP)—Though still in its infancy, Newfoundland's tourist industry is already big business.

The industry was of little value to the province before Confederation when only the hunter and fisherman crossed the Cabot strait with touring on their mind. These men were satisfied to rough it in the wilds, live in cabins and tent.

As a result no tourist accommodation was made available. The boom that struck the province following Confederation also affected the tourist industry and the number of visitors is increasing each year.

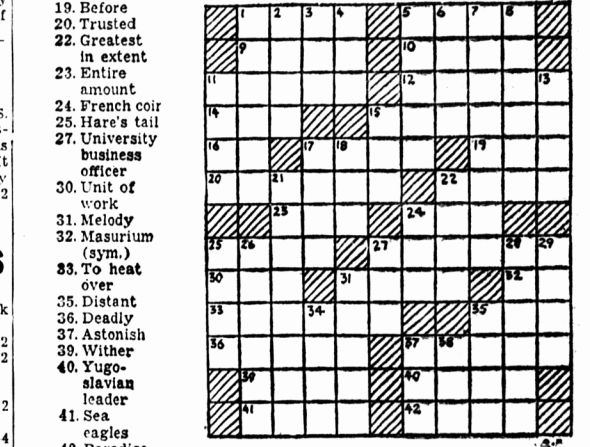
No count is made of the tourists entering the province but there is little doubt about the industry's progress. Hotels are more crowded each year, train and plane reservations harder to get, and guides are doing a bigger business.

The tourist office, directed by O. L. Vardy, a former member of

Premier Smallwood's provincial cabinet, is faced with problems unique in Canada. Accommodations are skimpy. Though there are several first-class hotels there is not enough room for all travellers. Lack of highways is another big factor, thus there are no roadside cabins or motels. The places tourists are most interested in seeing are the colorful outports, but a majority of these villages are without hotels or even guest houses. During 1953, the tourist bureau sent out 150,000 pieces of literature about the province. Another 30,000 prospective visitors asked for information. The industry will get a shot in the arm next summer with the completion of the new North Sydney, N. S., to Port Aux Basques ferry. This stimulant should keep business at a comparatively high pitch until 1956 when the trans-Canada highway is expected to be completed. That's when Newfoundland's tourist industry will come of age.

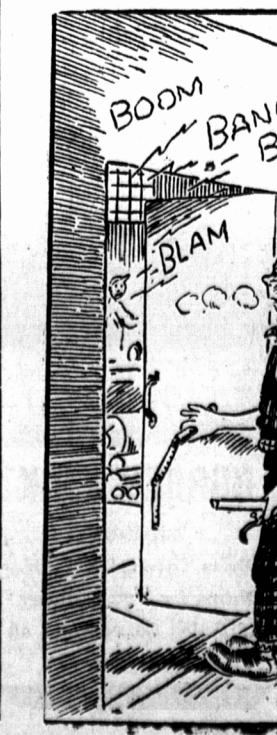
DAILY CRYPTOQUOTE—Here's how to work it:
