

Burbank's Awful Experience.

RESCUED ALIVE AFTER A JOURNEY OF NEARLY A QUARTER OF A MILE UNDER THE ICE.

A Montreal despatch says: James Burbank, owner of the grist mill at Massawippi, situated on the lake of that name, had a miraculous escape from death on Friday afternoon. He was cutting ice on the mill pond when suddenly the cake on which he stood broke away from the rest, and he was swept towards the dam 200 yards below. His companions on the pond were unable to render any assistance. Just as the ice cake toppled over the 30 foot dam, Burbank jumped. After a terrible struggle with the rushing waters he succeeded in grasping the edge of the timbers of the dam. Burbank clung there with the desperation of despair. It was simply a test of endurance. For half an hour he maintained his terrible position on the edge of the falls, but then benumbed with cold, the nails and flesh torn from his hands by the rushing waters, he was forced to let go, and was swept under the revolving wheels of the mill, and on under the ice in the river below. At this time the villagers who stood on the river both below and above the mill gave up all hope of ever seeing Burbank again. Great was their surprise to see him appear in an opening in the river, nearly a quarter of a mile below the mill, and cling to the ice at the edge. Several of the men at once ran to his assistance, and Burbank was dragged from the river insensible, but still alive after his terrible journey. Burbank states that, although only a few seconds elapsed from the time he let go until he was rescued, still every action of his life passed through his brain like a panorama, and his passage under the ice seemed to have lasted for ages.
