Ten Blood Clinics To Be Held Here

With the arrival of the Mobile team from the Maritime Depot of the Canadian Red Cross Blood Transfusion Service scheduled for Sunday night, Prince Edward Islanders will be given the opportunity all next week of being blood donors at the ten clinics to be held in nine different centres from one end of the Island to the other.

Eleven hundred donors are required at these clinics in order to meet the demands of patients in our local hospitals as well as our commitments for our armed services overseas during the next three months.

Since no clinics are to be held at Charlottetown or Summerside on this occasion it will be up to the residents in the different centres and surrounding districts to see to it that the objective of 1100 donors so urgently required is not only reached but exceeded.

A great deal of concentrated effort has been put into the organization of these clinics by those who are in charge in the different centres and Provincial Red Cross officials expressed confidence in the response to be received.
