It seems that the sale of tickets for seats at the first appearance in N. Y. of the historic beauty has realized \$10,000, one of the boxes going for \$520. The boxes and chairs were mostly bought up for a rise by speculators. The sale is the costliest made of seats for a first appearance since the debut in New York of Jenny Lind, the famous Swedish cantatrice.

There is a sort of vague impression, says the New York Shipping List, that England's public debt is all the while increasing. This is a mistake. She is gradually reducing it, it being at present about one-tenth less than it was twenty-five years ago, notwithstanding she has been during that time engaged in several costly wars. The rate of reduction, compared with the rapidity with which our public debt is being reduced, is slow, but it is nevertheless sure. During the last twenty-five years the combined indebtedness of the other nations of Europe has increased two-fold. Spain, Italy and Russia have done the worst, the increase in Russia's obligations being something like 250 per cent. The European debts, in round numbers, amount to about \$1,500,000,000.

Ingestre Hall, one of the seats of the Earl of Shrewsbury and Talbot, which was lately burned to the ground, was one of the most picturesque Elizabethan mansions in England, and was the principal seat of the Shrewsbury family. It is situated about four miles from the town of Stafford, in the midst of an extensive park. In anticipation of the return of the Earl and Countess to Ingestre, the hall had been thoroughly cleaned and renovated, and large fires had been kept burning daily in most of the rooms to air them. The first alarm was raised at a quarter past five in the morning when the head house-maid was awakened by a crackling noise. She immediately came out of her room, and on opening the folding doors leading up to the state bedroom from the principal landing she found it full of flames and smoke. She instantly aroused the other servants, who hurried out of the house without waiting to dress. Simultaneously the fire was discovered by a stableman who was coming across the park to the stables. He gave the alarm to the other men, and with all speed fetched the steam fire engine which was kept on the estate. A messenger was also despatched to Stafford, and the engines and brigade arrived at six o'clock. Immense volumes of water were thrown upon the burning building, but the fire could not be checked. The whole of the state-room floor, which was of massive proportions, fell through into the grand hall below. Some valuable paintings and old oak carved furniture were saved, but the whole of the silver was stowed in a safe in the cellar and could not be reached. Thousands of bottles of wine of a great age were lost, and the historical paintings on the staircase were all destroyed. The total loss, it is said may reach £100,000, which is partly covered by insurance. Lord Shrewsbury arrived about eleven o'clock, and superintended the removal of the articles saved.
