

Soundholeman Receives Support

The seven-day holding order of the association, announced today, should prevent blight-infested potatoes from leaving the province, and safeguard authorities here agreed Friday.

The order is on the authority of the provincial department of agriculture, and is made to guard the reputation of island potatoes, and safeguard buyers and consumers, at the same time.

Dr. F. H. Harrison, acting district inspector, fruit and vegetable division, Canada department of agriculture, said he feels that the seven-day period is long enough to detect any blight, and that the potatoes would probably deteriorate in appearance if they were held longer.

It has been difficult to protect potatoes from blight this season, because of the heavy rain, but he said that it has been the government and doctors prior to the bringing in of the act. That is, the potatoes were not given the rights and privileges of other potatoes.

Dr. Harrison said that one man, George Lawton, Powells Bay, is using it for top killing a man, and reports it is effective — it is also cheap and easy to use. A stronger solution is used for top killing than for blight control.
