Interment was at Lorne Street Cemetery. Many beautiful floral offerings, cards and letters were received.

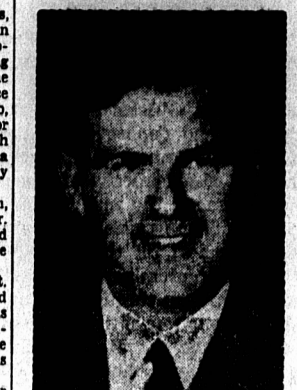
PERSONALS

Noted Evangelist To Conduct Mission Here



The great Layman Evangelist of England will be visiting Charlottetown to conduct a week-long Mission.

Mr. Thomas B. Rees, above, has had marked success in his evangelistic work in the United Kingdom, in the United States and in Canada. For four years in succession he has rented the Royal Albert Hall in London, which seats 10,000 persons and has had it packed, largely with young people, for his meetings. Mr. Rees will come from Saint John, New Brunswick to Charlottetown to commence his meetings on the night of June 4th in Saint Paul's Anglican Church.

On three separate occasions he has conducted campaigns in the United States and in Winnipeg where he went at the invitation of 140 churches. In addition to his services in Royal Albert Hall in London, he has campaigned in many of the large cities of Britain, including Glasgow, Cardiff, Belfast, Newcastle, Liverpool and in Dublin.

Mr. Rees is the founder and director of Britain's First Permanent Young People's Christian Holiday Conference Centre at Hildenborough Hall where more than 5,000 have attended conferences.

Brother of a Church of England clergyman, Mr. Rees, as a very young man, gave up a business career to be a lay worker at Sevenoaks Parish Church. In 1932 he was invited to go to Ireland to conduct an evangelistic campaign. Then he visited the United States and later spent a few years as pastor of an undenominational church at Banwell, near Weston-super-Mare. It was in Ireland, where he returned, that he determined to go to England and his first achievement at Central Hall, followed by his meetings in Royal Albert Hall. Today he is believed to have a following of something like 100,000 young people in London and outside it.
