

Many Canadians To Honor Birthday Of Robert Burns

The haggis will be piped in with ceremony in most Canadian cities this weekend when the "im-mortal memory" address is de- livered to commemorate Robert Burns Day Jan. 25.

Quebec City's St. Andrew's So- cety will do without haggis. "The haggis, thank heaven," said Lt.-Col. J. Gordon Ross, so- cety president. "My family has been in Quebec City for 149 years and we're far away from the cus- tom. Even new members who have come recently from Scot- land don't like it. Besides, there's one here who can make it."

Jan. 25 is set aside to commem- orate the great poet's birth on that day in 1759.

DECLARE A HOLIDAY
St. John's, Nfld., is probably the only Canadian city to declare a day an official holiday, but the Burns dinner was cancelled last year and no special celebra- tions were planned this year.

All Halifax there is to be a

dinner for the North British So- cety with Scottish music and singing and a pipe and drum band to wind things up. Saint John, N.B., will have its special dinner sponsored by the Heather Society, formed to promote High- land dancing.

The pipers will play in the haggis and there will be Highland Burns poems in 2 out 10 differ- ent clan group celebrations in Montreal. The scene of most cele- brations to be held Friday and Saturday nights will be the down- town hotels.

At Toronto some Scottish so- ceties have already held their Burns dinners so that evenings would not conflict.

Last Saturday the Order of Scottish Clans and the Sons of Scotland both held shindings in downtown hotels. Celebrations are to be held next Saturday by the grand camp of the Daughters of Scotland and the 48th High- landers Regiment along with sev-

eral other smaller groups.

Edmonton and Regina are to hold the annual dinner.

The St. Andrew's and Caledon- ian Society held off Burns night celebrations last Friday night in Vancouver. The Vancouver Ladies Pipe Band will have a haggis dinner-dance Jan. 24. The area has 24 Scottish organizations embracing some 5,000 members and all will be staging dinner- dances before Jan. 25.

The Ottawa celebrations are re- stricted to one dinner followed by Scottish dancing. The Ottawa Scottish societies have an agree- ment to take turns in sponsoring the dinner. This year's is given by Camp Argyle No. 26 of the Sons of Scotland Benevolent So- cety. More than 250 persons are expected to attend the party in Lansdowne Park convention hall.

C. N. R. Works Program Does Not Mean Sectionmen Back

The announcement of the C. N. R.'s supplementary winter work program does not mean that sec- tion men laid off last week will be returned to their jobs. This was stated yesterday by a spokes- man for Railway Headquarters in Moncton.

He said the program meant that the railway will begin certain works programs now that would ordinarily be left until later in the year so that no further reduction

in staff might be necessary. It was also stated that the rail- way in keeping with former poli- cies will give unemployed mem- bers of their staff the preference of employment in any such un- dertaking.

When asked about the condition of the roadbed of the railway on the Island Division, the railway official stated that from reports of civil engineers, they are sat- isfied that the roadbed is in con-

dition to handle the volume of traffic on the Island both safely and efficiently.

Moncton further stated that the number of section men per mile on the Island Division even after the layoff is still greater than in any other part of the C. N. R. system.

St. James Kirk Holds 133rd Annual Meeting

Following a delightful Buffet Supper served by the ladies of the Kirk Auxiliary an exceptionally large number of Kirk folk took part Monday Evening in the happy proceedings of this his- 133rd Annual Meeting of this his- toric Congregation, which was held in the Kirk Hall. The sup- per was served at individual tables in a most attractive set- ting surrounding a central table adorned with golden mums and candelabra to match, at which were served the Minister, The Rev'd. T. H. B. Somers, His Hon- orable the Lt-Governor, Hon. T. W. L. Prowse, the Clerk of the Kirk Session, Mr. Neil D. MacLean, and several of the senior Elders and their wives.

Immediately following the sup- per the Minister constituted the congregational Meeting with the reading of Holy Scripture and Prayer and called upon all to make confession of their faith by reciting the Apostles' Creed.

Mr. F. W. Curtis, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, was elect- ed Chairman of the proceedings and Mr. R. W. MacLean as Secretary.

The Address of the Kirk Session was presented by Mr. N. D. Mac- Lean and reviewed the many aspects of the Congregation's life and progress, noting a marked increase in attendance at Worship and the Sacraments, an addition of 37 new members, new gains in the Church School and the or- ganizations for the young, the ministry of the printed page in which 6,232 copies of the weekly bulletin were issued in 1957, the in- crease both in amounts contrib- uted and the number of members giving to missionary funds, the fund for European Refugee Relief and Inter-Church Aid, the As- sembly's Student Bursary Fund, the Ramsarop Transportation Fund, the Bible Society, Protes- tant Family Service Bureau and many other worthy causes, spe- cial services and historic occa- sions during the year, particularly the dedication of the new Cas- walt Organ in October, and the receipt of special gifts and mem- orials.

Tribute was paid to the memory of fourteen members who had passed away during 1957, men- tioning particularly Dr. J. Har- old Shaw, Mrs. Heath McIntyre and Mrs. T. F. Fullerton. "It is beyond our capacity properly to evaluate the extent and worth of the work done by our people," said the Address, "but we would assure all of our warm appreciation and gratitude. By such lov- ing service, by such faithful perseverance, by such willing generosity the work of our Redeemer has been furthered and His glory set forth before men."

Significant tribute was paid in both to the outstanding gifts and leadership of the Organist, Miss E. Lillian MacKenzie. "The Men of the Kirk", Report, prepared by the President, Mr. Donald G. Mac- Millan, was read by Mr. W. R. Burnett and reviewed its activities, particularly those on behalf of the Church School which ser- vices are greatly appreciated by the School staff.

In 1939 he returned to Charlottetown and went into the radio repair business with Mr. Angus D. MacMaster. Later he opened his own shop, which he has operated continuously ever since.

Though he does sell an odd radio, and is agent for a number of manufacturers, Mr. MacDonald emphasizes that his shop is primarily interested in repair work. His long years of experience, and constant study of all phases of radio are placed at the disposal of the public at reasonable rates.
