SENATOR FERGUSON ON THE SENATE.

Senator Ferguson thinks the Canadian Upper House a very useful body as it is. He claims that in defeating the Yukon Railway Bill of 1888 and the Redistribution Bills of 1899 and 1900 it rendered a signal service to the country. In thirty-nine years since Confederation he claims that no Bill which has passed the Commons was twice defeated in the Senate except the Redistribution Bill, but it may be thought that the exception was a rather objectionable one. Why should the Senate have interfered thus repeatedly to thwart the will of the popular Chamber in a matter which affected the basis of the latter House and did not affect the Senate at all?

Hon. Mr. Ferguson does not approve of Sir Richard Cartwright's proposals for Senate reform. That was to be expected, the more especially as he is disposed to defend the Senate as it is. He does not think any method of reform would materially improve its personnel which, he says, stands admittedly high. He thinks it altogether a misapprehension that the Senate does not effectively discharge its duty in respect of public business coming before it, and that this misapprehension would be removed if the press would only pay proper attention to what the Senate does.

What our readers will be chiefly interested in is the counter proposition which Mr. Ferguson submits, speaking in his own behalf. He would retain the principle of life tenure and appointment by the Crown with the age limits for appointment to be between thirty and sixty years. In order to keep the strength of parties approximately equal in the Senate he would give to the Leader of the Opposition the right to select a number of Senators in proportion to the voting strength of his party at the preceding election—the party disproportionately unrepresented to be given all the nominations until a fair start was obtained.

Another suggestion he makes is that in a Senate of 57, seventy-two might be selected in that way by the political leaders and 15 by the universities, so that the latter would hold the balance. The Premier would advise the Governor General as to the issue of the patents, but he would have to accept the nomination in the proper proportions from the leader of the Opposition and the universities. Of course no one will suppose that Senator Ferguson would expect the present or any future leader of a dominant party in Canada to accept his propositions as above outlined. But the Senator has much time on his hands and no doubt enjoyed the work of formulating his somewhat ingenious but quite impossible scheme.

THE CABINET CHANGES.

The promotion of Hon. Charles Fitzpatrick to be Chief Justice of the Supreme Court has been for some time expected and is in every way a suitable appointment. His ability, legal knowledge and judicial aptitude are unquestioned and in his new and exalted position as Chief of our highest court he will have the confidence of both parties and the country at large. On the other hand the removal of Mr. Fitzpatrick from the position of Minister of Justice has also been expected. Indeed the reason for the great Toronto lawyer being indeed to take a cabinet position was to provide a suitable successor at the head of the Justice Department when Mr. Fitzpatrick should retire. Everybody knew that Mr. Aylesworth was but a temporary Postmaster General, a position for which he had no special fitness. He will make a very capable and weighty Minister of Justice, but will lack something of the versatility and resourcefulness as a parliamentarian which so strongly characterized Mr. Fitzpatrick.

As for the rest, Hon. Mr. Lemieux becomes Postmaster General, with no special qualification for the post, though not wanting in legal ability. In any case it will probably be long before Mr. Lemieux or any other will achieve so great a success for himself or render such signal service to Canada and the Empire in the office of Postmaster General as it was the good fortune of Sir William Mellick to effect. Of many who have held that post since Confederation Sir William easily ranks first.

As we have intimated, the latest shuffle of portfolios further weakens the Cabinet somewhat, and notably so in its Quebec representation. The Administration which was first distinguished by the number of able men it contained, is now quite as noteworthy for the number of able men who have gone out from it. No Cabinet ever yet formed in Canada could well afford to lose so many strong and influential men as have for one reason or another retired from the Laurier Administration. Messrs. Davies, Tarte, Blair, Sifton, Mulock and Fitzpatrick, to mention no others, each in succession, with at most a single exception, has been succeeded by a man of less ability and lighter weight.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.

The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
