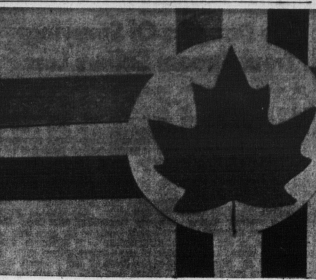

Timber Slicing In B.C. Sparks Company Probe

VANCOUVER (CP)—A three-
way slicing of a northwestern
British Columbia timber pie is
the subject of a concerned study
by two companies which didn't
get as large a piece as they
wanted.

Executive-level pondering by
the two has resulted in pulp
mill investment worth about
\$200,000,000 ranging in balance
—along with about 2,750 jobs.
Lands and Forests Minister
Williston cut down timber ap-
plications and relocated forest
boundaries in an announcement
Thursday.

His decisions affected applica-
tions for forest licenses from
MacMillan, Blodel and Powell
River Ltd., Columbia Cellulose
Ltd., and Bulky Valley Pulp
and Timber Ltd. to supply prop-
rietary pulp with pulpwood.
MacMillan will produce an
\$86,000,000 mill at Kitimat on
B.C.'s north coast. It will produce
740 tons a day initially. It ap-
plied for a pulp harvesting area
and a tree farm licence.
