

him, therein set forth as facts. Although they were determined to pronounce a verdict of guilty, and their intention would not be frustrated by the most complete refutation of those charges by Mr. Haviland, they did not dare to allow him an opportunity to reply to them; for however they might disregard and set aside his answer, they dreaded the consequences to themselves of the conviction of its truth, and sufficiency which it might effect and establish in the public mind. They were consequently determined, not only to find him guilty, but also to do so without the observance of the usual or prescribed forms of justice; and to demand justice, at their hands, could, therefore, have no other effect, than to shew in how little estimation they held it, when its due observance would interfere with the designs of their party.
