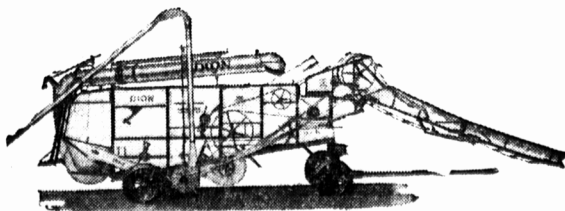

He appealed for the friendly hand, the working hand and the giving hand, and although one might be asked to do the impossible, it could be done by faith, just as the man held out his useless hand when Jesus asked him and concluded, "Rise up! Stand forth and go forth!"

Mr. Vernon DesRoches who has been employed in Arlington left recently for Toronto where he intends spending the summer months.

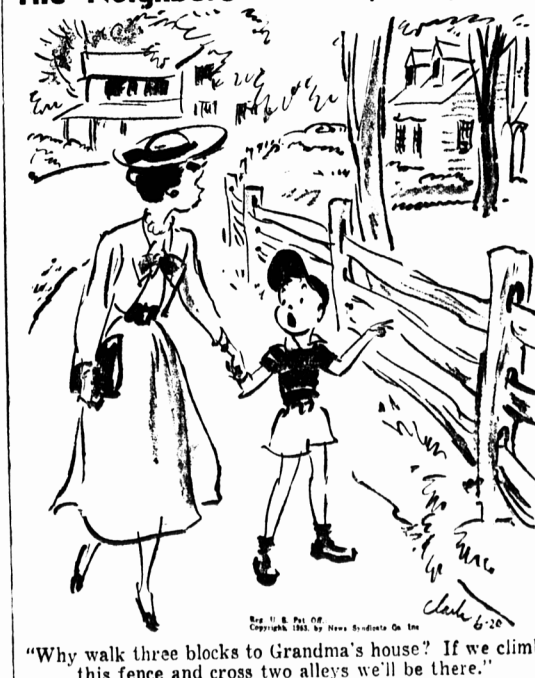
