May Drawing To Close; Trout Are Looking Good

The month of May is down to its last few days and cold, windy weather has been predominant. The 24th and 26th are the only days that hit the red hot bracket. It has been a disappointing month for the anglers in the wool fly caster but the spinning rod addicts have found some success in the Vernor and North River Causeways. The trout method is used and a trick is to keep the lure a few feet from the bottom. The board motor has to be throttled down just right. Three and four pounders are quite common place and one has been hooked that topped the five pound mark. One under exceeded three that weighed eleven pounds. The Vernor Causeway has produced a lot of fresh run trout, some with the scales coating their side. The trout in the North River Causeway have moved up toward its mouth and it also has produced some real tackle busters.
