BRITISH TRADE COMMISSIONER HERE - That the Royal visit to Canada would have beneficial effects on Canada's trade relations with Great Britain was the opinion expressed yesterday by Mr. F. J. Gick, Montreal, His Majesty's Trade Commissioner in Newfoundland and the Maritime Provinces, who is visiting Charlottetown officially. Mr. Gick, who is accompanied by Mrs. Gick, is remaining here until Thursday, and is afterwards meeting importers and others interested in trade connections with the United Kingdom. He is one of five British Trade Commissioners located in Canada, including the Province of Quebec, whose duties are chiefly concerned with questions of trade policy between the Dominion and British Governments.

COUNTY COURT - In the case of R. T. Holman Limited vs. Mr. William Noye, Hampshire, tried in the County Court of Queen's County, judgment for the plaintiff was given by His Honor Judge Duffy on the 19th day of June, 1939. This was an action brought to recover the price of an Enterprise Monarch Range sold by the plaintiff to the defendant, the latter claiming that it would not work satisfactorily. After hearing the evidence of both parties, including evidence of witnesses for the plaintiff who had tested the range in actual home use and having been shown in evidence food cooked to perfection on the stove, the Court inspected the stove for quickness of operation and heating. It was held the evidence showed that the range worked satisfactorily and judgment was given for the plaintiff for the full amount of the claim, together with costs and counsel fee.

Prevent Sunscald In Young Pigs When a white skinned pig is constantly exposed to the hot spring or summer sun it is just as apt to suffer from sunburn, or what is called sunscald, as a human being. All young growing pigs of the white breeds have tender skins, and are more susceptible to sunscald than older pigs of the same breed, or pigs with dark coloured skin.

Usually the first part affected is behind the ears. If the exposure continues, the top of the neck, top of the shoulders, and finally the back and sides may become burnt and sore, showing a slightly reddish or inflamed appearance. Later this is followed by a dry scale or scabby state, after which cracks frequently appear in the skin, gradually becoming deeper and more painful, and the unfortunate pig shows abnormal slowness or weakness of the back, and may frequently be seen wincing with pain.

However, it is possible to overcome the effects of sunscald by suitable and timely preventive measures. If young pigs are allowed out for a short period daily during dull weather, the time of exposure gradually lengthened, their skin becomes hardened, and there is little danger of sunscald. And they do need shade, supplied either by cabins open sheds or trees.

If the pig does show the effect of over-exposure to the sun, carbolic vaseline is excellent because of its cooling, softening and healing action, according to Live Stock officials of the Dominion Experimental Farms. Some butter dairy farmers have even found that used crank case oil is effective. Treatment should be repeated at intervals of a week or ten days, until all parts have healed. It is well to remember to keep the pigs in the shade after using either the vaseline or oil, as otherwise they may suffer some serious injury.

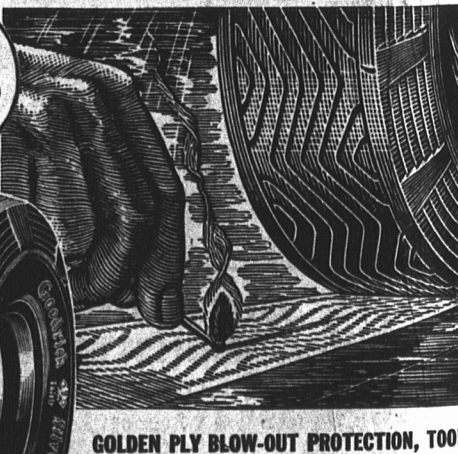
