\$5,000,000 DAM AIDS FARMERS IN ONTARIO



Albert Bowman, farmer in Ontario's Upper Thames Valley district is only one of the many valley dwellers, who formerly lived in dread of yearly river floods. Now under the instruction of the Upper Thames Valley Conservation Authority, Bowman (seen above with wife and child), has

doubled production on his 144-acre farm in three years by halting erosion. His farm supports 34 milk cattle compared to 16 in 1949. By changing farm methods to include such anti-erosion tactics as contour plowing, planting of trees on land too poor to crop and various draining schemes,

millions of acres in the London district have been restored to their productivity of 100 years ago. Farmers will be greatly aided too by the completion this month of the \$5,000,000 Fanshawe dam, near London, a major step in flood control in southern Ontario.

U. S. STEEL

CLEVELAND, Oct. 26 (AP)—Unless the current coal strike drags out, producers of consumer durable goods will get as much steel next quarter as they did in the quarter just ended, Steel magazine says today.

The weekly metal-working industry magazine reports the national production authority administrator said last week consumer durable goods producers would average 60 per cent of their 1952 third quarter steel allotment during the first quarter of 1953.

"That didn't mean less steel would be available," the magazine says. "The remainder of the steel produced in the first quarter is to be used to fill orders carried over from the third and fourth quarters as a result of the two-month steel strike."

"Thus the makers of consumer durable goods would get as much steel in the first quarter as they have been allotted in any recent quarter. They even might get more."

The national steel-making rate held unchanged last week at the all-time record high of 105.5 per cent of capacity, yielding 2,200,000 net tons of steel for ingots and castings, the magazine said.

N. Y. Stocks In Good Recovery After Slump

NEW YORK, Oct. 26 (AP)—The stock market dipped into critical territory last week and then made a smooth recovery. It ended with a net loss on the week, however, without giving any clear cut indication that it intended to continue its upward movement.

There were two significant developments in the dividend field. Pacific Mills omitted its dividend due at this time after paying 50 cents quarterly previously. The action caused momentary concern in the market.

Texas Co. raised its regular dividend to 75 cents from 65 cents, and that encouraged a rally in the oil division.

The week started under the cloud of the spreading coal strike, and the market declined a little. The next day was calm with prices down a shade.

On Wednesday the selling storm hit the Associated Press average of 60 stocks dropped \$1.0 at \$103.60. Thursday the recovery started with railroads leading, and it continued on Friday until the net loss on the week was only 40 cents in the AP average.

The five most active issues on the New York Stock Exchange last week were:

Socony-Vacuum up 3-8 at 33 7-8 with 52,800 shares traded, American Telephone up 1-2 at 153 1-4, General Motors off 5-8 at 58 3-4, Northern Pacific up 1-4 at 69 1-4, and Serval up 1-8 at 11.

Canadian issues closed the week mixed. International Nickel and Dome Mines both gained 1-8.
