Our spirit must continue to grow stronger and not weaken," William Shields, a member of the Carpenter's Local, told the men. He said that the protest parade in Summerside on Saturday had to be held in the afternoon instead of the morning, as had been planned, and that some of the impact was lost because of the change in time.

He said that spirit in Summerside is running high and the men are very definite about their stand in the matter of low wages.

Lloyd White, member of the Charlottetown District Labor Council, said, "we're 100 percent behind you men in your protest." He told the meeting that a committee is presently doing ground work to find the best possible way to give aid.

A fine of \$100 and costs of 10 days was imposed upon Donald Mullin, Crapaud, when he appeared before Provincial Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, yesterday on a charge of impaired driving. The accused was arraigned in Queen's County Magistrate's Court.

Philip Arnold Acorn, Lower Newton, pleaded not guilty to a charge of failing to stop before reaching a schoolbus which was stopped to take on or let off passengers. The case was adjourned to April 29 for trial.

Waldon Mann, Irishtown, was accused of wilfully neglecting some of his farm animals, to wit a horse, two bulls, two steers, three heifers and three cows, and entered a plea of not guilty. Testifying for the crown were SPCA officers John Harkness, Summerside, and Ernest Bigger, St. Eleanors. Representing the accused was Bert Campbell. The case was adjourned to April 28 at City Police Court for further hearing.

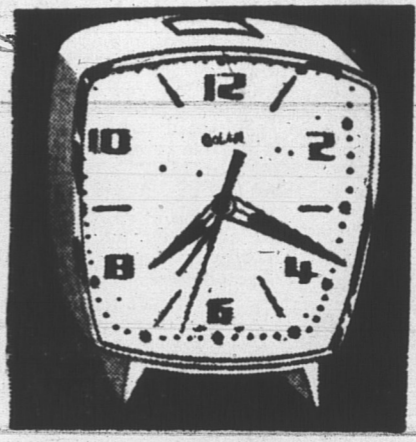

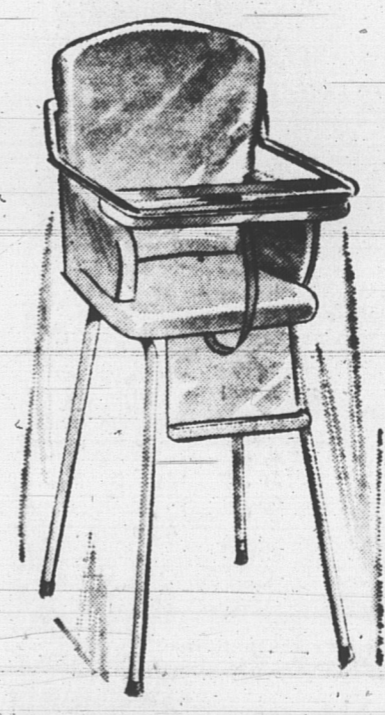

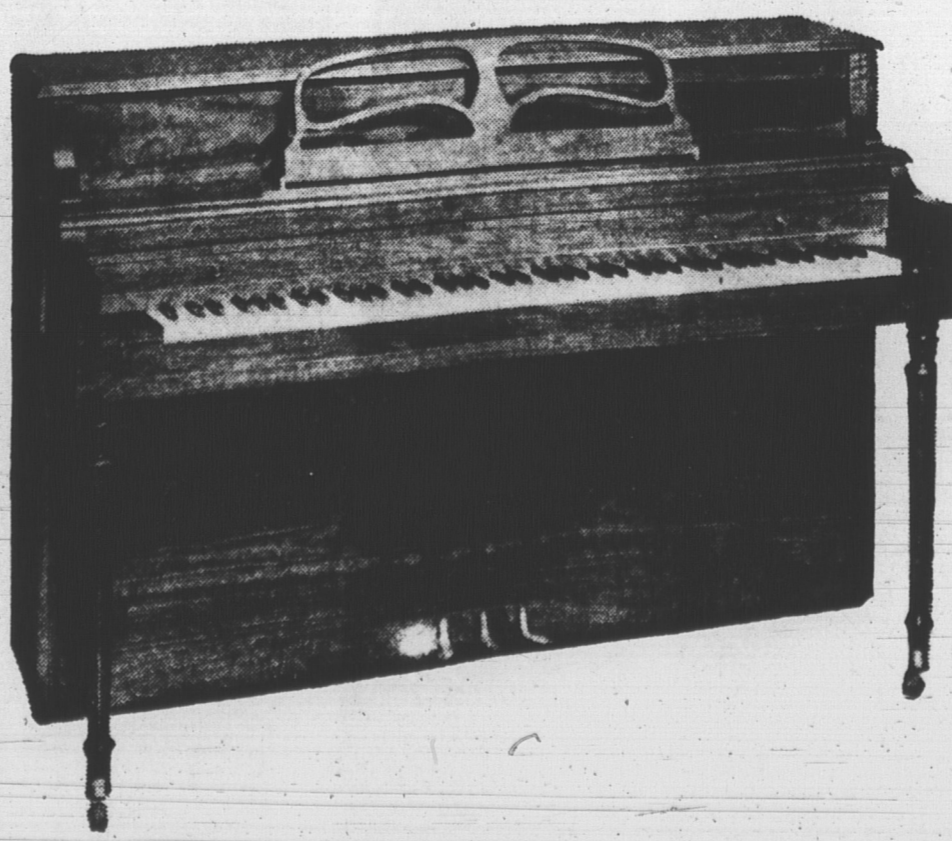
