British Tourists In Canada Expected To Double In '67

LONDON (CP)—The British tourist invasion of Canada is expected to double in Centennial Year, a Canadian travel official estimated here as a team promoting Montreal's Expo 67 wound up a five-day British tour.

Surveys indicate some 147,000 Britons will visit Canada next year. This figure represents nearly half the total number of

visitors expected from the whole of Europe. The Canadian government travel bureau here has already received \$5,000 enquiries about trips to Canada.

Radiation Protection Division Queried On Fallout Reports

Periodic reports say that concentration of cesium-137 is higher among reindeer and caribou than other animal species. This is because they feed mainly on lichen, which tends to retain the fallout isotopes more than other vegetation.

As a consequence, Eskimos who eat large amounts of reindeer or caribou meat are found to have larger concentrations of cesium-137 than others.

Chrysler Sales Show Uptrend

DETROIT (AP)—Chrysler Corp. has reported a rebound in its automobile sales for the middle 10 days of May. The gain was 17 per cent over the first 10 days, but six per cent off a record high set for mid-May a year ago.

Chrysler reported its dealers sold 41,233 units, a daily rate of 4,581, in the May 11-20 period.

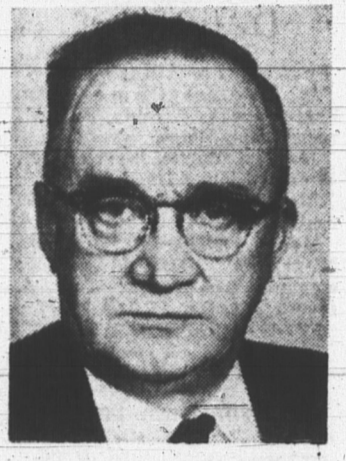
In the first 10 days of May, Chrysler reported retail sales of 30,895, a rate of 3,902 daily. That was 13.6 per cent below the May 1-10 volume of 35,770 for the same days of 1965, when the rate was 4,471.

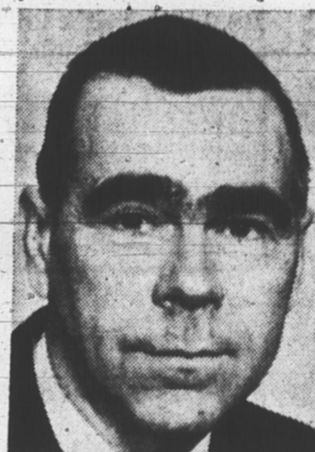

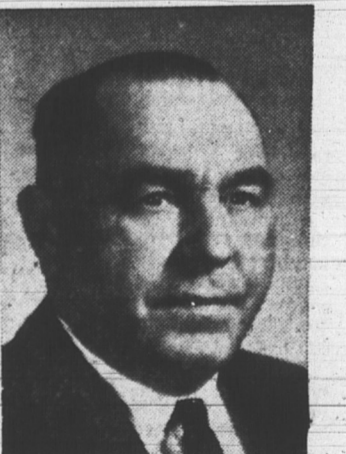
