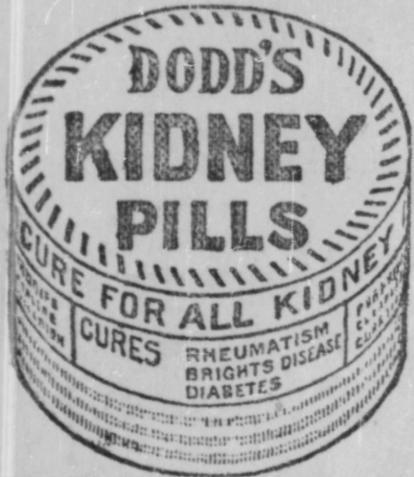

ELECTION FRAUDS.

In two recent Ontario bye-elections, West Huron and West Elgin, it has been proven that more votes were cast for the Conservative candidates than were counted by the deputy returning officers. In the West Elgin case, one of the deputy returning officers appears to have been personated by an individual who forged the true official's name. At Saulx Ste. Marie another personator of a deputy returning officer is openly charged with destroying ballot's and doctoring the poll book. As "Standard Elevators" our latter-day Liberals are peculiar.

The people raised a storm of protest against the numerous taxes imposed by the Peters administration, but it remained for the present government to 'cap the climax' by the invention of new taxes, hitherto unthought of. Unless there is a change of rulers, Prince Edward Islands local taxes will soon be as heavy and as varied as that of free-trade England."

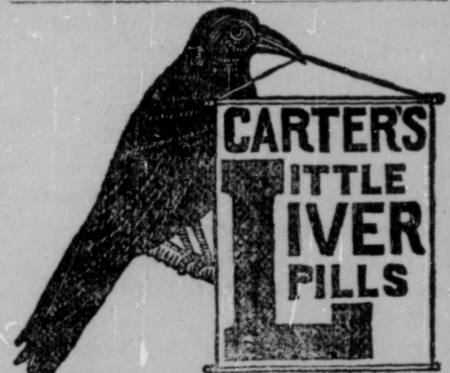
