Construction Progresses On Runway At Ch'town Airport

Construction on the new runway at the Charlottetown airport is making good progress, it was reported Saturday by resident engineer Joseph Stanish. Work was begun on the million dollar plus project last July 8th and is scheduled for completion in October of 1959. One quarter of the primary sub grading has already been completed, but operations will come to a halt within the next few weeks because of seasonal mud. Morrison and MacRae Ltd. of Summerside have the contract for subgrading, paving and drainage which will cost in excess of a million dollars. Terrorists Hit Heavily At British Troops In Cyprus

By SHAHE GUEBENIAN Nicosia, Cyprus (Reuters)—Terrorists hit hard at British troops in widely scattered ambushes Sunday as Britain's plan to bring peace to bloody Cyprus stalled on the conference table. A British soldier was killed and five others wounded in bombings and machine-gun attacks against military vehicles across the British colonial island. The death brought to 92 the number of British soldiers killed since the Greek underground organization EOKA started its guerrilla campaign for union with Greece 3½ years ago. The attacks coincided with a large-scale anti-terrorist operation by the British which followed the murder Friday of a 40-year old English mother of five children in Famagusta. GREECE BALKS Meanwhile, in Athens, Greek political observers said the government would not agree to round-table talks on Cyprus unless the duties of the Turkish representative were severely limited. Turkey has agreed to the British plan for shared control of the island with Greece for seven years. The observers, however, said the Greeks would want promises from Britain that the Turkish representative, now in Cyprus, would confine his functions to purely diplomatic liaison and take no part in local administration. These were the stipulations believed included in the Greek answer to a proposal that a NATO-sponsored conference be attended

Destroyer Escort St. Croix Is Commissioned

SOREL, Que. (CP)—HMCS St. Croix, a sleek destroyer escort with twin rudders and a top speed of more than 25 knots, was commissioned into the navy Saturday as the second of a new class of Canadian ships to combat nuclear submarines.

Mrs. H. F. Pullen, wife of Rear-Admiral H. F. Pullen, the navy's Atlantic coast flag officer, acted as the ship's sponsor for the commissioning and christening ceremonies.

Mines Minister Paul Comtois was guest of honor. He described the St. Croix as another vessel to add to the Canadian navy's "reputation as a force that might well be feared by any enemy." The ship carries a peacetime crew of 12 officers and 198 men under Commander K. H. Boggs. Built here at the shipyards of Marine Industries Limited, the 366-foot St. Croix was launched Nov. 17, 1958. Her displacement is 2,900 tons.

NEW DIVISION She follows the HMCS Assiniboine into service in the Restigouche class, a new division developed from the St. Laurent class of the Second World War. The Assiniboine, also built by Marine Industries, was commissioned in 1956.

The new vessel is the navy's second to bear the name St. Croix. The first was torpedoed and sunk by German submarines in the Second World War. The battle took place in the North Atlantic in 1943 and only one of her crew survived.

The navy said the new St. Croix has been designed "specifically to deal with the most modern submarine or its successor of the foreseeable future under a variety of weather conditions, including the worst extremes of the North Atlantic."

Advancements in homing torpedoes and sonar and heavier armament, as well, set the ship apart from destroyer escorts of the St. Laurent class.

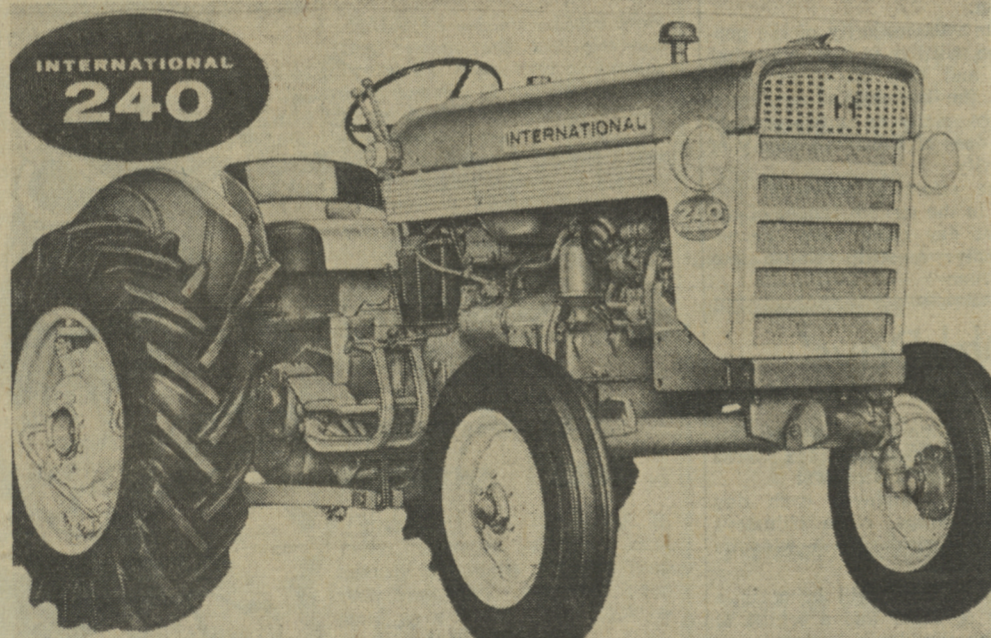

FREDERICTON — (CP) — A special general meeting of the New Brunswick Barber's Association, Sunday, attended by more than 200 barbers from all over the province, decided that effective October 15, adults will pay a minimum of \$1.00 and children under 12 years, 75 cents for haircuts.

These are prices already prevailing in most centres. It was also decided that in order to deal with problems peculiar to various areas in the Province such as closing hours that the association would be divided into sections.

The executive suggested county associations be formed, each responsible to the provincial organization.

PORT AUX BASQUES, Nfld. (CP) — Mayor Walter Hodder said in an interview Sunday the new ferry William Carson will end unemployment in this coastal town of about 5,000.

The \$12,000,000 CNR ferry began regular service across the 96-mile Cabot Strait from North Sydney, N.S., Sunday. Mayor Hodder said the new service "will double the town's population in 10 years." The railway employs about 600 here.
