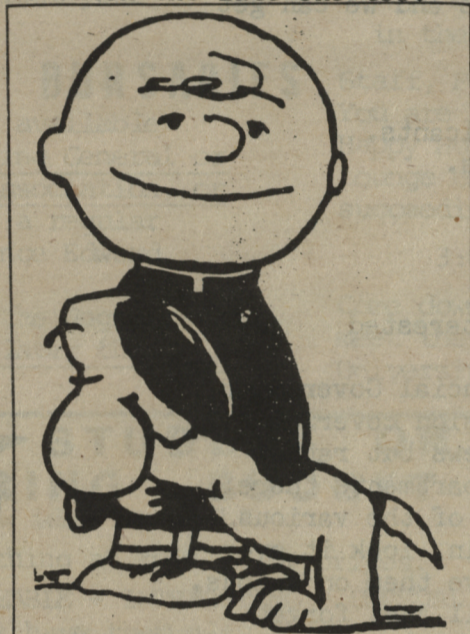


MONTY PYTHON AND THE HOLY GRAIL
