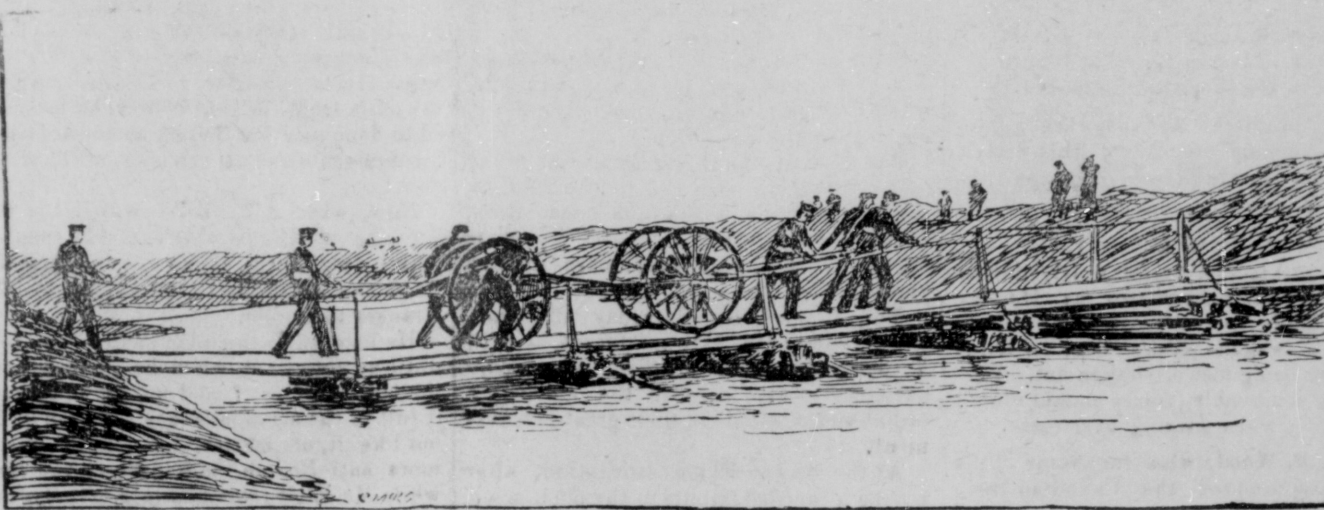

CANADIANS COMPLIMENTED.

LONDON, March 2.—Lord Roberts is apparently still at Paardeberg.

In his address to the Canadians he attributed to them the most important share, in bringing about the surrender of Cronjé's army.

On Wednesday last Remington scouts were in touch with the Boer force, 7,000 strong, in the direction of Bloemfontein, but nothing is known of the result of the skirmishing.

WHAT WILL THE BOERS DO?

LONDON, March 2.—The columns of this morning's newspapers bear testimony to the wild enthusiasm of the people of London and throughout Great Britain and the Empire on account of the relief of Ladysmith.

It is, at present, too soon to judge of the attitude of the Boers in consequence of the complete change in the military situation.

The Transvaal Legation, at Brussels, have, however, issued a statement to the effect that Bloemfontein will not be seriously defended by the Boers. Eu-

forces will be concentrated in the neighborhood of Winburg.

INNISKILLING'S LOSSES.

At the roll call, after the unsuccessful storming of Pieter's Hill on Friday, only one officer and forty men of the Inniskillings responded out of 600. At daybreak, however, several turned up and the casualties are estimated by a news correspondent at 400.

THE PRISONERS

LONDON, March 2.—The prisoners captured at Paardeberg will be encamped on the athletic grounds adjoining the military camp at Greenpoint, two miles from Cape Town.

The latest news from Kimberly states that the Boers are looting in the Barkley West district.

ALBRECHT'S OPINION.

LONDON, March 2.—The Standard's correspondent sends some interesting remarks by Major Albrecht on the conduct of the war.

He expressed the opinion that all British tactics up to Magersfontein had been stupid. But he praised the strategy adopted since then by Lord Roberts, and blamed Cronjé for blundering in locking up his men in a hole instead of occupying the kopjes.

OFFICIAL RECOGNITION.

OTTAWA, March 2.—The officer commanding the Militia of Canada has much pleasure in announcing that Lieut. Col. Otter, commanding the 2nd Special Service of the Royal Canadian Regiment has reported that the battalion under his command did well in the engagement on the 27th ult., especially Captain H. B. Stairs of the 66th Fusiliers, Halifax, and Captain A. H. McDonnell, of Company "G," in the Royal Canadian Regiment.

PRICE OF PEACE AND SAFETY.

LONDON, March 2.—Army estimates, which were issued last night, reached the

unprecedented amount of £61,493,400, and provide for 430,000 men.

In comparison with last year's estimates, this means an increase of 245,147 men and an increased cost of over £400,000.

CLEAR OF THE BOERS.

LONDON, March 1.—Lord Buller wires from Nelthorpe, under today's date, that he has just returned from Ladysmith and that the whole country is clear of Boers.

[CANADIANS AT PAARDEBERG.]

PAARDEBERG, (by courier to Kimberly, Feb. 28.)—Yesterday was a glorious day for the Canadian soldiers here. By their gallant conduct they have earned the admiration of the whole army and commendation of Roberts himself.

The name "Canadian" is now a synonym for bravery, dash and courage.

For days the column, thirty thousand strong, had been drawing lines closer around the laager of Cronjé's army.

The advance was made by sapping along the bank of the Modder River.

The brigade commanded by General Smith-Derriën, in which were the Canadians, occupied a position on the west bank of the river. The trenches of Canadians extended four hundred yards on the river bank to the east, facing those of the enemy and six hundred yards—(Owing to the breaking of the telegraph wire, the message stopped at this point.

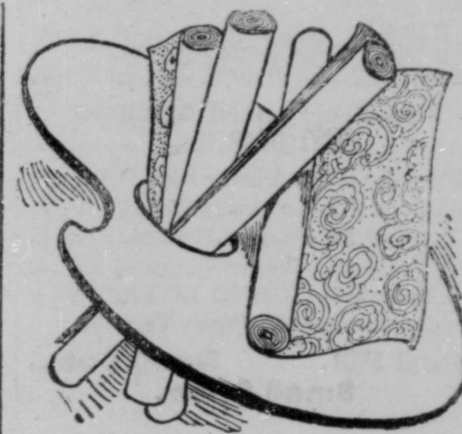
