Lions Club Inducts Member; Attendance Pins Presented

GEORGETOWN — King Lion Joseph E. "Sonny" Johnson presided over the regular meeting of the Georgetown Lions Club held Tuesday night in the St. James Hall. The King Lion inducted a new member in the person of Lawrence Murphy and presented Lions pins to Mr. Murphy and to Joey Walsh, who had been inducted at an earlier meeting.

The secretary, Eric Wood, read the minutes and reported on the Lions district cabinet meeting held in Shediac, N. B. Sept. 12, and attended by Mr. Wood and Allan MacPhee.

The financial report was presented to the meeting by the treasurer, Guy Coffin.

Fourteen members of the Club were presented by the King Lion with perfect attendance pins for the year 1964-65. It was decided that the club would write the town clerk, asking the permission of the town council to hold weekly dances at the dance hall in the rink.

The club also is seeking permission to obtain the old council chambers in the town hall to use as a club room. If they are obtained the club will redecorate the room and operate it at no cost to the town.

The question of the holding of a Glaucoma clinic in Georgetown, sponsored by the club, was discussed. It is hoped to hold the clinic on some date during the month of November and the club is considering ways and means of raising the money necessary to defray the expenses of the clinic.

George Key Jr., 34, was sworn into office yesterday at a brief ceremony at the town hall.

Magistrate R. S. Hinton, QC, officiated, and counselled Frances Perry, Eric Johnston, J. Ernest Morrison and Herbert Schurman were in attendance.

Mayor Key won the civic post by acclamation Tuesday. He replaces W. E. Jenkins who resigned earlier this month for health reasons.

When first elected to the council five years ago, Mayor Key was also the youngest councillor ever.

Assault Case Is Adjourned

GEORGETOWN — The case of Bruce Gormley of Murray Harbor, charged with assaulting Garry Wayne Herring, was adjourned by Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, in the King's County Court at Georgetown yesterday until Sept. 22 in Charlottetown to set date for trial.

Gormley is represented by G. R. Foster and Herring is represented by John P. Nicholson. It is a private prosecution.

Deputy Attorney General J. Arthur McGuigan, QC, represented the Crown in all the other cases.

Roy Edward Bell, Montague, charged with assault had his case further adjourned until Sept. 22 to fix date for trial.

John Daniel MacDonald of Montague was fined \$25 and costs for the illegal possession of liquor not purchased at a vendors.

Alphonse Francis Deagle of Lower Rollo Bay pleaded guilty to the attempted theft of a quarter of a cord of pulp valued at \$4.00. He was fined \$50 and costs.

The case of John Wallace MacNeill of Milton charged with driving without fire and attention was adjourned until Sept. 22.

\$125 Fine Given For Impairment

Rosemond J. Hachey, Kent Junction was charged with drunken driving and pleaded guilty to the lesser charge of driving while impaired when he appeared before Magistrate James Haslam QC in city police court yesterday. Hachey was assessed \$125 and costs or 30 days.

Gerard MacDonald, city, charged with theft under \$50 (a bicycle) was given a two-year suspended sentence and a \$500 bond was posted.

David M. Wood, Burnaby, charged with failing to stop at a stop sign was fined \$5 and costs or two days.

There were eight liquor act violations on the docket.
