TORONTO (CP) — Premier Robert's has announced the fourth session of Ontario's 27th Parliament will begin Tuesday, Jan. 25. Again this year the 106 members are faced with a growing amount of legislation that could keep the house at work until late spring or early summer. Major bills expected to be introduced include those dealing with tightening securities legislation, redistribution of the province's electoral districts, and revision of metropolitan Toronto's form of government. The standing in the House is 77 Conservatives, 23 Liberals and eight New Democrats. After redistribution nine seats will be added to the legislature, giving it 117.

Murder Charge 20 Years Late

KITCHENER (CP) — Harry Dietrich, 48, has been remanded to Dec. 15 on a capital murder charge in connection with the death 20 years ago of Elmer Battler of Kitchener. Battler, a taxi driver, was a hunting trip July 13, 1945, in the Breslau area. Dietrich was shot through the head while on a hunting trip in the area. He was released after an inquest brought in a ruling of accidental shooting. A mental examination has been ordered for Dietrich, brought from London, Ont., by police officers to face the charge.

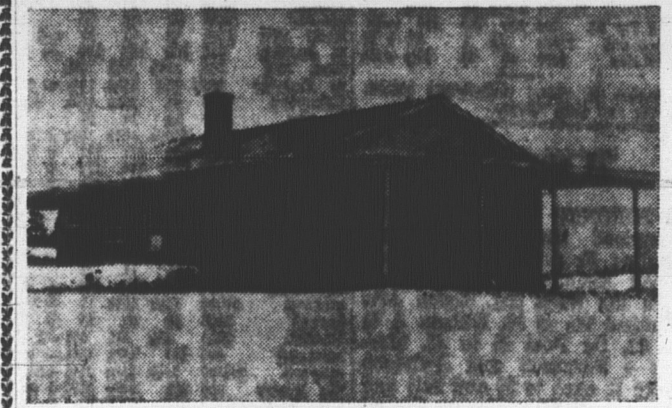

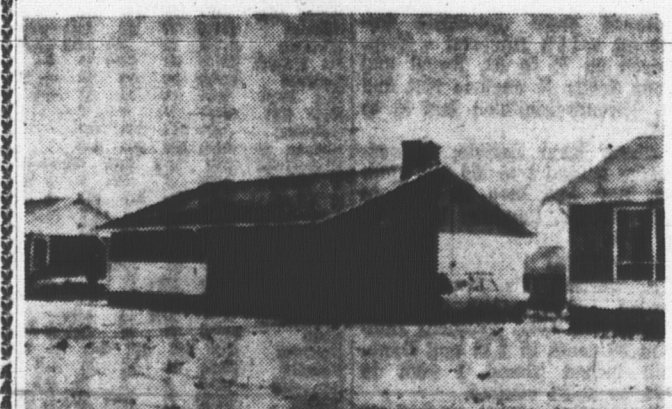

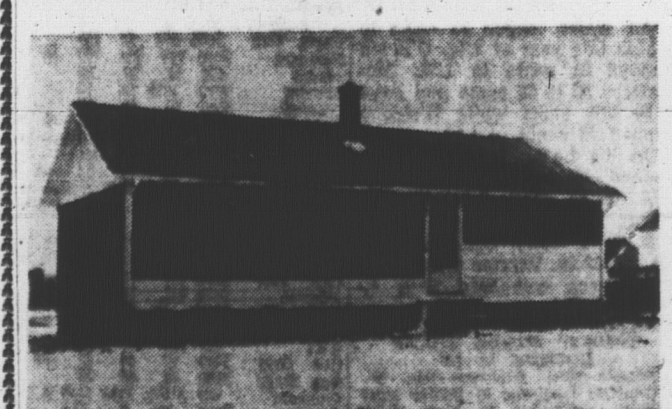
