WINNIPEG, April 17—(CP)—

Coarse grain prices showed an easier tone in early trade today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange but rallied towards the close and extreme losses were reduced. Rye, which also showed early declines, moved up to close higher in response to a better tone in American rye. Demand came from U. S. houses during the dull trade. Flax was inactive.
Columbia took a small lot of Canadian wheat in the only export business reported today. Class two wheat prices remained unchanged at \$2.25.

TV Shares Hit New Peak On N. Y. Exchange

NEW YORK, April 17—(AP)—Radio-television shares absorbed a selling wave today in the stock market and rebounded to new peak levels for the year.
Buying sentiment also centered in steels and aircrafts while motors and rails were generally ahead.
The rest of the market was backward for the most part resulting in a general mixture of gains and losses that left prices on averages just about unchanged.
The recovery strength of radio-TV shares was surprising in view of the pounding they took Saturday and the immediate selling that hit them with the opening of the market today.
The leadership of the steel group was impressive, and buying there spread to motors and rails which ended generally unchanged to higher.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks remained unchanged at 76.1. The industrial component lost 1 of a point, rails were up 2 and utilities advanced 1 of a point.
The volume stood at 2,500,000 shares as compared with 2,750,000 shares on Friday, the seventh time this year the volume has gone above the 2,500,000 mark.

AT MONTREAL

MONTREAL, April 17—(CP)—Stock prices were mainly stronger in active trading on the Montreal stock exchange and curb market today.
Industrial volume was 114,700 shares traded and mines had a turnover of 217,600 shares. Fractional changes generally covered the board, with the odd issue moving more than a point.
The exchange's closing averages showed gains off 0.01 at 30.03; utilities up 0.1 at 32.0; industrials up 0.6 at a new high of 148.9; papers up 3.83 at a new high of 432.34 and golds up 0.46 at 66.72.
International Paper advanced 1 1/2 points to a new high of 46 in papers, followed by Abitibi which gained 1/2 at 26 1/2, Fraser up 1/2 at 27 1/2, Powell River up 1/2 at 49 1/2 and Consolidated Paper up 1-8 at 2 1/2.
In utilities, Brazilian Traction was up 1/4 at 25 5-8, Shawinigan up 1-8 at 25 1-8, while Winnipeg Electric was off 1/4 at 40 1/2. Bell remained unchanged at 40 1/2.
In base metals and senior oils International Petroleum advanced a point to a new high of 11 3-8, Imperial Oil was up 1/4 at 26 3-8, Royalite up 1/4 at 18, Consolidated Smelters was up 1/4 at 97 3-4, Hudson Bay Mining up 1/4 at 4 1/2, and Nickel up 1/4 at 31 3-8, while Bulolo Gold was down 25 cents at a new low of \$8.00.

At Toronto

TORONTO, April 17—(CP)—Prices on the Toronto Stock Exchange today moved irregularly in a narrow price path.
Base metals showed a slightly stronger tone on gains in a few key issues. Hudson Bay added 1/4 at 4 1/2 and Labrador Exploration was ahead 20 cents at \$6. Eureka Mines and Asot Corp. were active and higher. Considerable selling developed in Wattle Amulet, United Keop Hill and East Sullivan.
