BRITISH OPINION

Temperance Workers are Much Encouraged.

GREAT INTEREST TAKEN IN THE RESULT OF THE PLEBISCITE

(From the Special Correspondent of the Montreal Star in London.)

LONDON, Oct 1—Temperance workers here are jubilant over the prohibition plebiscite. Mr. Caine, ex-M P, and a temperance leader, predicts that this century will close with every liquor shop, distillery and brewery in the Dominion swept out of existence.

The Canadian plebiscite must influence the British Royal Licensing Commission now in session under Viscount Peel. The United Kingdom Alliance officials here are jubilant and say that the watchword at the annual meeting of the alliance on October 18th, will be "Forward, Canada has led the way."

The Daily News says that law unenforced eats at that respect for law, which is at the very basis of national stability. 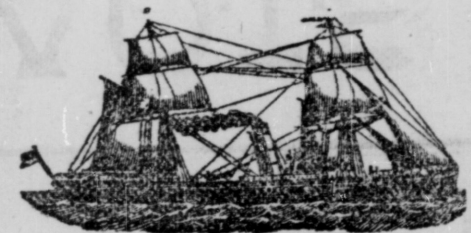
